

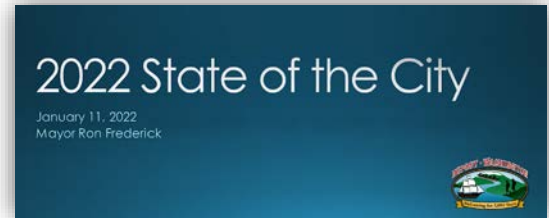

### City of DuPont receives SEEK Grant - \$172, 000



The City of DuPont Parks & Recreation Department has received a recreational “Summer Experiences and Enrichment for Kids” (SEEK) grant in the amount of \$172,000 to serve youth in and around our community. The purpose of the SEEK Fund is to help agencies increase their community's access to quality, outdoor summer programming for youth and communities who have historically been underserved and who have been most impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Funding will help support outdoor programming occurring April 15<sup>th</sup> – September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Programs will focus on social, emotional, mental health, and academic needs for our youth through outdoor recreation and programming.

The grant is from the Washington Parks & Recreation Association (WRPA), in collaboration with Association of Washington (AWC) and made possible by funds provided by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). Staff will be working with the Park Commission for additional public outreach on program interests for all youth, ages 4 through 21. To search for utility information on the website, go to [www.dupontwa.gov](http://www.dupontwa.gov). From the HOME page, chose Departments and then Utility Billing. From the list on the right, you can find the following:

# Who do I call if I have an emergency?

*Call if you can, text if you can't.*



Have an emergency?

Want to report an in-progress crime or incident?

**DIAL 9-1-1**

For instances where you need an officer to immediately respond.

(Examples: burglary, domestic dispute, assault, suspicious person(s) and/or vehicle(s))

Want to speak to an officer ?

Need to report something that is not in-progress?

**Call 253-287-4455**

The dispatchers at South Sound 9-1-1 are standing by to take your call and notify on-duty officers of your need/concerns.

**\*\*This number also dispatches for the Fire Department AND Animal Control\*\***

Don't know who to call?

Need help?

Call DuPont Police Department and speak to an administrator.

**Call 253-964-7060**

Administrators are available to speak to you and help you determine the best way to help you.

Have an emergency, but cannot talk?

**TEXT 9-1-1**

- Open a new text message.
- Enter the numbers "9-1-1" in the "To:" field.
- Type a brief message in the message field.  
(INCLUDE the location and description of the emergency)
  - Click the "Send" button.
