STORMWATER

Hello Residents of DuPont!!

It's your friendly Neighborhood Storm Drain here. I know you're wondering why your neighborhood storm drain is reaching out to you. Do you ever wonder where all that rainwater goes or what happens when all those leaves, trash, oil leaks, car soap, or pet waste goes when rains wash them to me?

Well, I'm here to let you know that I send all that rain, leaves, trash, and debris straight into our lakes, streams, rivers, and even the Puget Sound. That's right! Unfiltered debris goes right into the waterways where our fish and our beloved Orcas live and eat. Now, you may be saying, "Oh, no that's not good!" or "How disgusting!" and you're right; it's not good at all.

But don't fret, you Neighborhood Storm Drain is here to let you know how to help! There is a super cool program called Adopt-a-Drain going on here in the City of DuPont. Adopt-a-Drain lets you pick a drain, (or even two or three if you're ambitious) near your home to adopt. Adopting a drain means you will help take care of it by spending just 15 minutes twice a month sweeping up all the dirt, leaves, trash, and debris. Once you're done, you track your impact online about how much and what kind of debris you cleaned up, and that's it! Yep, that's right, 30 minutes a month can save tons of pollutants from entering our waterways (3,503 pounds since October in the Puget Sound). And the coolest part about the Adopt-a-Drain program is **YOU GET TO NAME YOUR DRAIN!!** Some examples of drain names in the Puget Sound are Hermione Drainager, Sir Drains-a-Lot, and my favorite, Drainasaurus.

In light of recent property crime and catalytic converter thefts within our community, this is a great example of regional law enforcement cooperation making DuPont safer...

On February 10, 2022, at approximately 11:30pm, while conducting a crime suppression emphasis patrol in the 100 block area of Barksdale Ave., a suspicious vehicle occupied by multiple subjects caught the attention of a DPD officer. The officer was able to identify that the vehicle in question was related to recent property crimes in Bonney Lake, to include Catalytic Converter theft and possible Burglary. DPD units converged on the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop. After conferring with the Bonney Lake Police Department, DPD officers were able to positively identify two of the occupants as suspects in the aforementioned crimes. During the course of the field investigation, DPD Officers discovered that one of the suspects was in possession of an illegal dangerous weapon (unrelated to the Bonney Lake investigation). The vehicle was sealed, and a Bonney Lake Detective responded to the scene to take custody of the evidence and vehicle, pending a search warrant. DPD Officers booked the suspect with the illegal weapon into jail. Great work by DPD patrol - and thank you, Bonney Lake PD, for your coordination and partnership!

Pet Safety Tips

- Pets are curious. They may bump into, turn on, or knock over cooking equipment.
- Keep pets away from candles, lamps, and space heaters.
- Always use a metal or heat-tempered glass screen on a fireplace and keep it in place.
- Keep pets away from your chimney's outside vents. Have a "pet-free zone" of at least 3 feet away from the fireplace.
- Consider battery-operated, flameless candles. They can look and smell like real candles.
- Some pets are chewers. Watch pets to make sure they don't chew through electrical cords.

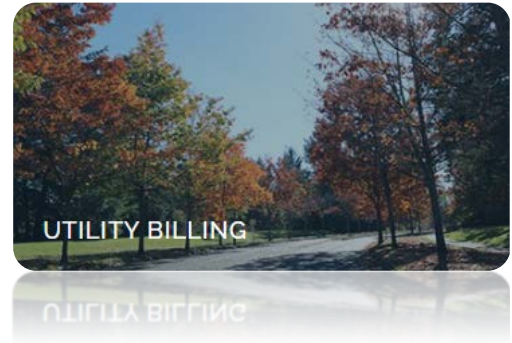
