EMERGENCY vs. NON-EMERGENCY: Who do I call?

Dial or text 9-1-1 for police, fire or medical emergencies when immediate action is required. For example:

- There is a situation that could, or does, pose a danger to life, property or both.
- There is suspicious activity involving person(s) or vehicle(s) that appears to have criminal intent.
- Any situation that requires immediate dispatch of an officer.
- To report a serious crime, such as robbery, domestic violence or sexual assault.

Call if you can, text if you can't!

YOUR CONNECTION TO POLICE, FIRE AND MEDICAL AID

Dial (253) 287-4455 to reach SS911's non-emergency line if you need police assistance that is not of an emergent nature but **IS** a valid police matter. For example:

- Reporting a nuisance, such as noise or parking complaint.
- Reporting a non-emergent crime; one that did not just occur, and the suspects are not in the immediate area.
- You have questions about something suspicious occurring in your neighborhood and you are not sure it is criminal activity

The call taker will determine how to best handle your call.

NOTE: A call taker may place you on hold to answer an emergency phone call.

Dial (253) 964-7060 to reach the DuPont Police Department's Administrative line when you have general questions. This line is only answered during normal business hours, Monday thru Friday, 8:00AM to 5:00PM. Any voicemails left will not be heard until the following business day. This would also apply to any emails sent to Police@dupontwa.gov.

Fire Safety Message about Kitchen Fires



In the Event of Stovetop Fire:

- If the fire is small and contained in a pan, put on an oven mitt, and smother the flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan
- Turn off the burner
- Don't remove the lid until it is completely cool
- Never pour water on a grease fire***
- Never discharge a fire extinguisher onto a pan fire since it can splatter burning grease out of the pan and spread the fire***



In the Event of Oven Fire:

- Turn off the heat
- Keep the oven door closed to prevent you and your clothes from catching fire
- Notify other occupants, and evacuate the building
- Call the fire department



In the Event of Microwave Fire:

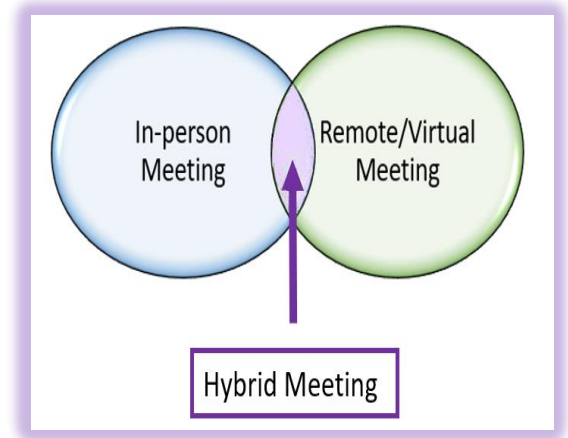
- Keep the microwave door closed
- Unplug the microwave to remove the source of heat
- Notify other occupants, and evacuate the building
- Call the fire department

COUNCIL CHAMBERS UPGRADE – Hybrid Meetings Starting in March

The City of DuPont is looking forward to opening the doors to Council Chambers now that we have the technology to hold meeting both in-person and remotely.

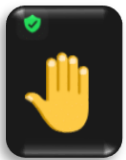
Little did we know back in March of 2020, the City of DuPont would have to shut our Council Chambers and resort to remote/virtual meetings for so long. To allow citizens to participate in a full functioning “hybrid meeting,” Council Chambers has been upgraded.

What are “hybrid meetings?” Hybrid meetings incorporate both in-person and remote access to meetings. This allows citizens to attend in person as they did before the shutdown, or they can attend remotely using an online meeting tool.



What changes might be noticed when attending an in-person meeting at City Hall? There have been many exciting changes in Council Chambers, but citizens might not notice much of a change unless they look closely. There are new speakers hanging down from the ceiling, a slightly new layout of the staff desk, new microphones, new name plates, and four new viewing screens. What might be harder to notice is the new meeting managing equipment and the upgrades to the audio/visual equipment and the computer connections. The room has been given a thorough cleaning and is all set for meetings.

What changes will be noticed if citizens attend remotely, as they have done since March of 2020? Citizens will still call into a meeting using the Zoom.us link found on each meeting agenda, whether they wish to watch the meeting or make public comments. To make public comment remotely, a citizen will “raise your hand” to speak during the public comment or public testimony portions of the agenda; raising your hand is a feature in the Zoom webinar screen. DuPont-Steilacoom Road Updates from March 28 – April 1:

- Between Center Drive and Wharf Road: Stump removal on the east side of the road (JBLM side).
- Between Pendleton Avenue and Davis Place: Grading for fence placement on the east side of the road (JBLM side).
- Please note, there could potentially be intermittent traffic stops throughout the project to move equipment across the road, etc.

3. Set your timers to prevent overwatering or underwatering your lawns and flower beds.

Backflow

Backflow is a term in plumbing for an unwanted flow of water in the reverse direction. It can be a serious health risk for the contamination of potable water supplies with foul water.
