Safety Message - Window Safety

The Window Safety Task Force offers these tips to help protect children from accidental window falls:

- When young children are around, keep windows closed and locked.
- When opening a window for ventilation, use those located out of a child's reach.
- Supervise children to keep child's play away from windows, balconies, or patio doors.
- Avoid placing furniture near windows to prevent young children from climbing and gaining access to an open window.
- Don't allow children to jump on beds or other furniture to help reduce potential falls.
- Don't rely on insect screens to prevent a window fall. Insect screens are designed to keep bugs out, not to keep children in the home.
- Install ASTM F2090 compliant devices designed to limit how far a window will open or window guards (with quick-release mechanisms in case of fire or other emergency) to help prevent a fall.

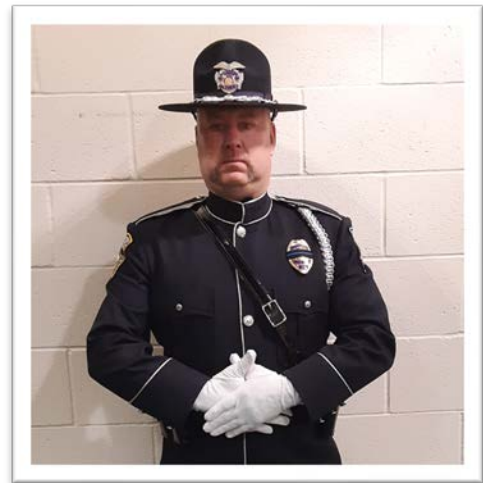
From the Desk of the Chief: Staff Spotlight

This is DuPont Police Sergeant Dan Saboe. SGT Saboe started with the DuPont Police Department in 2004 as a lateral police officer. Many of you know him as a helpful, community-oriented law enforcement professional – but you don't see him patrolling our city in this uniform.

What you may not know is that SGT Saboe has been a member of the Metro Pierce Honor Guard since its establishment 15 years ago. Comprised of officers from various agencies within Pierce County, the Honor Guard is a regional asset, providing important customs, courtesies, and comfort during formal events. Unfortunately, the majority of these events are fallen police officer memorial services as a result of line-of-duty deaths. Often unseen and thankless, SGT Saboe and his Honor Guard colleagues ensure that the very best of our profession is represented during our darkest times. The formal show of respect, and gratitude for sacrifice, upholds the most honorable traditions of American policing. More importantly, it pays tribute to the grieving family and friends of the fallen.

SGT Saboe has participated in well over 20 police officer memorial services, including two over the past month. He has also represented DPD in past National Police Week Memorial services in Washington, DC. He ensures that your police department, and this entire community, is represented during these solemn events.

Please help me thank SGT Saboe for his quiet professionalism and dedication to this city – along with the rest of the Metro Pierce Honor Guard for their service.
