- Remove the lint that has collected around the drum

- Clean the vent pipe at least once a year

### **2022 NATIONAL POLICE WEEK:**

**GRATITUDE FOR THOSE WHO HAVE MADE THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE WHILE IN THE SERVICE OF THEIR COMMUNITIES.**

Established by a joint resolution of Congress in 1962, National Police Week pays special recognition to those law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others. President Kennedy proclaimed May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day, and the calendar week in which May 15 falls as National Police Week.

There are approximately 18,000 law enforcement agencies in the U.S. – over 15,000 of them are local police/sheriff's departments. Of these, 75% are law enforcement agencies of less than 24 officers. On average, one police officer is killed in the line of duty every 54 hours. SO FAR IN 2022, 105 POLICE OFFICERS HAVE DIED, WITH THREE OF THEM FROM WASHINGTON STATE:

- Officer Dan Rocha, Everett Police Department
- Deputy Sheriff Dominique Calata, Pierce County Sheriff's Department
- Donald Sahota, Vancouver Police Department

This year, National Police Week is May 11–17. On May 13, 2022, the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington, DC held ceremonies - including the 34th Annual Candlelight Vigil - to honor the fallen officers whose names have recently been added to the Memorial.
