Medic-25 requested routine transport from Faulk once, but the call was later canceled.

Safety Message - As summer comes to and end, it's time for drivers to be ready for students returning to school and bus traffic. Please remember the following:

- Don't block crosswalks.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and take extra care in school zones.
- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.
- Never pass a bus, change lanes, or make U-turns while driving in a school zone.
- Always stop for school buses loading or unloading children.
- All vehicles must stop if no physical divider is present.
- 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them to safely enter and exit the bus.

CRIME PREVENTION INFORMATION:

KIA & HYUNDAI OWNERS

Property crimes continue to reach record levels throughout the region. Of that, auto theft is skyrocketing within Pierce County. We are seeing this trend affect DuPont as well. To add to this issue, if you own a Kia from 2011 or newer or a Hyundai from 2015 or newer, your vehicle may now be specifically targeted by auto thieves. There is a new "Tik-Tok Challenge" detailing how to steal Kias and Hyundais that have keyed ignitions (as opposed to push button start) by utilizing a USB cable (See the news link below). If you own these vehicles, please consider parking them securely within a garage, or using a mechanical steering wheel locking device. If you have questions about the type of locking device to purchase or how to use them, you are welcome to come by the police station during business hours (Mon-Fri, 8a–5p) and an officer can assist you.

UTILITY DEPARTMENT

We are very excited to announce the Utility Department has streamlined access for citizens to request a variety of utility services. In early September, we will be launching improved and more efficient ways for citizens to submit and the department to process the following utility forms:

- Start Service Applications
- Stop Service Applications
- Update Account Information
- Rental Authorization Form
- Utility Deposit Waiver Form
- Water Leak Adjustment Form

For now, citizens (renters, owners, rental housing businesses, etc.) will continue to access forms the same way, using the **“How Do I”** and **“Update, Start or Stop Water Service”** tabs on the website.

Watch for our announcement in early September on the city’s website and on Facebook letting everyone know the forms have been updated. When the new forms are available, access them, similarly, using the **“How Do I”** tab. From there, citizens will need to look for **“Access Utility Services”** where all the forms will be available with just a click of a button!
