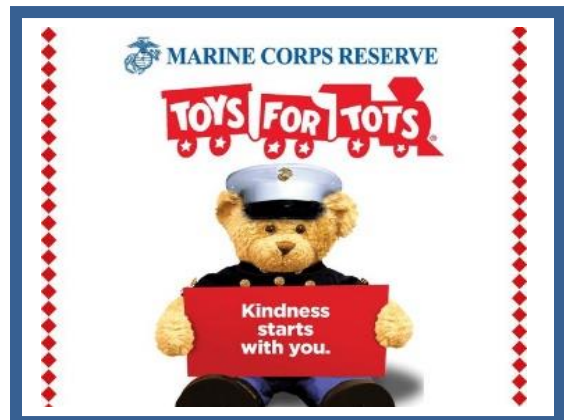

DEPARTMENT NEWS

- DuPont Officers assisted Lakewood PD with a vehicle involved in an armed robbery by attempting to deploy stop sticks on I-5. The pursuit continued south, and suspects were eventually apprehended and taken into custody in Thurston County.
- A DPD officer conducted a ride along with a citizen.
- Speed emphasis was conducted on Center Drive, McNeil Street, and Steilacoom DuPont Road.
- Command Staff hosted a Thanksgiving dinner for officers.
- For the third year, the DuPont Police Department is proud to partner with the Marine Forces Reserve in supporting the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation. CRIME AWARENESS: ARMED ROBBERY

The DuPont Police Department is seeking any information which may assist in the identification of the suspects involved in the armed robbery of a Jack-In-The-Box Restaurant located in the City of DuPont, occurring on November 17th, 2022, at 5:30pm. DuPont Police patrol units arrived within three minutes of the 9-1-1 call to find the suspect(s) had left the area in a vehicle in an unknown direction. No one was injured during this incident, which is currently under active investigation. ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY: ARMED ROBBERY SUSPECT

The DuPont Police Department is seeking any information which may assist in the identification of the suspects involved in the armed robbery of a Jack-In-The-Box Restaurant located in the City of DuPont, occurring on November 17th, 2022 at 5:30pm.

The above pictured subject was the passenger in the above vehicle, which parked in the drive through lane. The suspect entered the restaurant through the drive-through window while brandishing an unknown caliber/model black handgun, taking the cash from the register. Victims/witnesses described the male suspect as a black male, with a full gold-metallic teeth covering, black "Polo" hooded sweatshirt, thin build, approximately 6' to 6'2" and spoke with a noticeable accent (victims describing the tone as possibly from Florida or Louisiana). The vehicle (possibly a 2003-2008 Infinity FX35 with no license plate, but bearing an unknown dealership placard and after-market dark wheels) was driven by an unknown race "heavysset" female. DuPont Police patrol units arrived within three minutes of the 9-1-1 call to find the vehicle had left the area in an unknown direction.

DUPONT POLICE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH CRIME PREVENTION TIP

PACKAGE THEFT PREVENTION

- **Have your package(s) shipped to your work address.**
If your employer allows it, have your packages sent to work and keep them off your porch altogether.
- **Enlist the help of your neighbors.**
If you have neighbors or friends that are usually home during the day, ask if they will accept your packages and/or keep an eye out for your deliveries.
- **Require a signature.**
Consider requiring a signature so your package won't be exposed to thieves.
- **Get technical.**
Think about investing in low-cost technologies like light timers, motion sensors or doorbell cameras to protect your deliveries.
- **Take advantage of alternate delivery options/alerts.** Many delivery companies offer lockers that will store your packages until you are ready to pick them up. Some are open 24 hours a day. Make sure you pick up your packages during daytime hours or in a well-lit area. Visit these websites to research locations near you:

- **Keep your porch clear and visible.**
If a thief has no place to hide, they are less likely to risk being seen on your porch taking your packages.

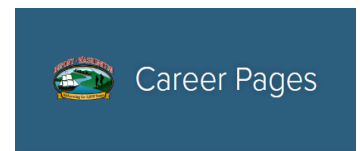

Fire Safety Tip – Water your tree every day!



Put a **FREEZE** on Winter Holiday Fires

It's fun to decorate for the winter holidays, but holiday decorations can increase your risk for a home fire. As you deck the halls this season, be fire smart.



Half of the home decoration fires in December are started by candles.



More than 1/3 of home decoration fires are started by candles.



Christmas is the peak day for candle fires.



Keep candles at least **12 inches** away from anything that burns.



A dry Christmas tree can burn very hot and very fast.



More than 1 in every 5 Christmas tree fires were caused by a heat source too close to the tree.



Read manufacturer's instructions for the number of light strands to connect.



Make sure your tree is **at least 3 feet away** from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, space heaters, candles or heat vents. Also, make sure your tree does not block exits.



Get rid of your tree after Christmas or when it is dry.
