CULTURAL EXCHANGE AT DUPONT POLICE:

This past Monday the DuPont Police Department was honored to host a group of international college students visiting the U.S. as part of [Tacoma Community College](#)'s International Programs. Forty students from the [Learnmark Horsens](#) Gymnasium HHX & HTX school in Denmark, accompanied by their teacher, Bitten Jensen, were our guests for a cultural and educational exchange. Chief Newman gave a presentation on the American Criminal Justice System and the differences between state and federal laws. Our friends at the [FBI – Federal Bureau of Investigation](#) Seattle Field Office provided a presentation on federal law enforcement, by Senior Supervisory Intelligence Analyst Long T. "LT" Chu, Supervisory Senior Resident Agent Grant Mann, FBI Tacoma, and FBI Community Outreach Specialist Alhagie Manneh. After a joint DPD and FBI Q&A, DPD officers took the students on a tour of the station and provided hands-on demonstration of police equipment and training – to include allowing students to participate in interactive scenarios with our use of force simulator. A very special thanks to Tacoma Community College's Department Office of International Programs for this important opportunity to represent American law enforcement, and we are grateful for our close partners at the FBI.
