2023 NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

This week is a very special week for the DuPont Police Department, and every other law enforcement agency across the nation – just as it has been every May 15th since 1962, when President Kennedy signed a proclamation designating this week as Peace Officers Memorial Day and Police Week.

On this week every year, tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, D.C. to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice. While the epicenter of Police Week is at the Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington D.C., every police department uses this week to pay homage to the heroes who have laid down their lives in the service of their communities while upholding the rule of law.

In 2022, 246 law enforcement officers died in the line of duty – four of which tragically occurred in Washington State (Bellevue Police, Everett Police, Vancouver Police and close to home, Pierce County Sheriff's Department). Each one of these heroes left behind a family, friends and the communities they selflessly served. A major part of Police Week in our nation's capital is hosting and honoring the fallen's families.

As we honor Police Week, last week Pierce County held the annual Law Enforcement Memorial ceremony. It was our honor to participate along with our partner agencies in the county (Pictured: Deputy Chief Moore reads the "The Final Inspection" poem as part of the ceremony).
