## **SCHOOL'S IN SESSION!**

It's that time of year again! Kids in the Steilacoom Historical School District No. 1 headed back to school on Thursday, August 31st ...

Remember:

- Yellow flashing lights are your signal to SLOW DOWN - the speed limit decreases to 20 MPH in school zones. During the morning and afternoon school travel times, as well as for after school activities, speed cameras in school zones will be on.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Traffic in and around the schools gets pretty congested before and after school, and kids can be hard to see - especially when they are close to your vehicle (in front of OR behind)!
- Heads up, phones down! Kids are sometimes in a hurry to get to school before the bell rings and may dart out into the street suddenly.
- STOP! For school buses when lights are flashing, and the signal is out.
- Watch for school crossing guards and follow their instructions.
