## **The City of Dupont Announces New City Administrator**

DuPont, Washington (February 28, 2024) Mayor Ron Frederick is pleased to announce the appointment of Keith Campbell as the new City Administrator for the City of DuPont. The City Council confirmed Mayor Frederick's appointment during its February 27 meeting. Mr. Campbell assumes the City Administrator role, succeeding Andy Takata, who is retiring from the position.

The City of DuPont selected SGR to assist in conducting the extensive search that resulted in an impressive candidate pool. SGR is an executive recruitment firm based in Keller, Texas, specializing in recruiting, assessing, and developing innovative, collaborative, and authentic leaders for local governments. SGR's proprietary recruitment and vetting process produced an incredibly strong field of candidates. The City received 24 applications from candidates in eight states.

Mr. Campbell has 17 years of local government experience, with almost 10 years in city management. Most recently, he served as the City Manager in the City of Sherwood, Oregon, from October 2021 to November 2023. Prior to that, Keith led the City of Stayton, Oregon, as the City Manager from 2014 to 2021. Earlier in his career, he served the City of Shawnee, Kansas, as the City Clerk, and before that, Campbell was the Deputy County Clerk for Douglas County, Kansas. He is a credentialed ICMA Manager and received the GFOA Distinguished Budget Award from 2016 - 2022.

Mr. Campbell holds a master's degree in public administration and a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Kansas.

Mayor Ron Frederick reviewed all the candidates over a two-month period. "We are thrilled to bring Mr. Campbell on as our next City Administrator. We had a very strong group of candidates, but the breadth of his experience in city government makes him a great fit to lead the organization."

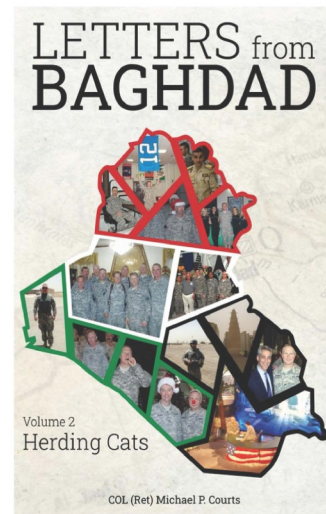
## DuPont Historical Society & Museum presents Reading & book signing by Mike Courts

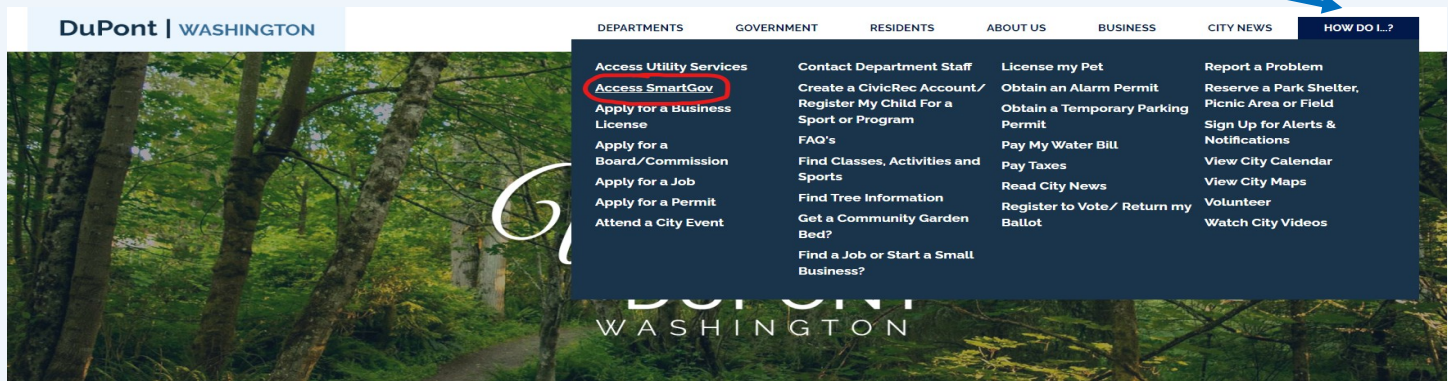

# I-5 - Mounts Rd. to Steilacoom-DuPont Rd. Corridor Improvements

Beginning in late summer 2023, contractor crews working for the Washington State Department of Transportation will begin construction on Interstate 5 in DuPont near Joint Base Lewis-McChord. This is the third in a series of projects that widens I-5 to add HOV lanes between DuPont and Lakewood.

## Improvements coming to DuPont and JBLM

In addition to extending the I-5 HOV lanes, construction crews will make improvements that enhance mobility and safety in DuPont and near the JBLM DuPont Gate at exit 119, including:

- A new bridge spanning I-5 and the railroad. The new bridge will feature a partial Diverging Diamond Interchange and a shared-use path for pedestrians and bicyclists between JBLM and DuPont.
- Direct access between JBLM and both directions of I-5.
- A new roundabout connecting Steilacoom-DuPont Road and the new overpass.

The project will also add a new signal at the intersection of the southbound I-5 off-ramp at Mounts Road (exit 116) and improve the I-5 vertical clearance over Pendleton Avenue.

## What you can expect

Construction will begin in summer 2023 and is expected to be complete in 2026. The project consists of multiple stages that involve overnight and weekend ramp closures, lane shifts onto temporary pavement, potential speed limit reductions, and bicycle and pedestrian detours. Crews will contain dust and debris to the construction site and will minimize noise as much as practical. Clear signage will indicate required detours throughout the project.



The project extends HOV lanes in both directions into DuPont.

## Safety Message - Kick off March with Spring Cleaning Fire Safety Tips - Check out these six indoor fire safety tips:

### Clear out any clutter from your home, especially in hallways and stairways.

Did you know that clutter provides fuel for a fire to spread? Make sure that all of your exits are clear and have a clear path to them. If you have any items blocking an exit, move them immediately. This ensures your family will have good escape routes should you need to evacuate due to fire.

### Check Your Smoke Alarms & Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Test your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are working properly. Now is an excellent time to install them if you don't have any. Replace your carbon monoxide and smoke detector batteries and look for any corrosion on the batteries or their connection points in the device. Replace the entire device if you notice any corrosion inside the battery compartment. Otherwise, supply your carbon monoxide and smoke detectors with a fresh set of batteries.

### Don't Use Electrical Appliances or Tools with Frayed Cords

If you have any electrical appliances or tools with frayed electrical cords, replace them as soon as possible. Using damaged electrical cords could start a fire. This is also an excellent time to check your extension cords too. Too many devices plugged in can overload the outlet and cause a fire.

### Check for Water Around Electrical Appliances

Check for water around electrical appliances, such as your washing machine, dryer, or dishwasher. If you notice any water, have a professional inspect your appliance to make sure it is safe to use.

### Check all of your appliances to make sure they are in good working condition.

This includes your stove, oven, microwave, toaster, coffee maker, and anything else you use daily. If you notice any issues with an appliance, have it repaired or replaced as soon as possible.

### It's a Great Time to Clean Your Clothes Dryer Vent & Lint Trap

Regularly clean your clothes dryer lint trap. Lint is highly combustible and can easily cause a fire if it isn't removed. Clean your dryer vent and hoses once a year to remove and prevent any excess lint buildup or blockages.

Crimes of opportunity are easily preventable!

### LOCK YOUR VEHICLE
