Strategic Planning Sessions

City Council and department heads met on March 5 and 6, for Strategic Planning Sessions.

Discussion topics included: Review of City Vision/Mission Statement, Review of Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats (SWOT) from 2022, review of Council priorities from 2023 and 2024, financial review, sidewalk policy, Community Center, bond and levy information, suggested staff priorities, and priorities for the 2025 and 2026 budget.

The Strategic Planning Sessions were led by Andrew Neiditz who is an experienced local government executive and was appointed in 2020 as a senior advisor by the Washington City Managers Association (WCMA).

DuPont City Council and Nisqually Tribal Council Meeting

The DuPont City Council met with the Nisqually Tribal Council on Thursday, March 7, at the Nisqually Indian Tribal Council Chambers in Olympia.

Discussion topics included: Collaboration between the Nisqually Indian Tribe and the City of DuPont, Development in Dupont, Old Fort Lake, Sequelitchew, Restoration Plan, Tree Plan, Museum, and the Tribe's upcoming future projects.

The DuPont City Council thanks the Nisqually Indian Tribe for their continued partnership with the City.



City of DuPont Earns 2024 WellCity Award



The Association of Washington Cities (AWC) recently released a list of the cities, towns, and other local governments that have earned the distinguished WellCity designation. The City of DuPont is among this year's recipients. This recognition is bestowed to entities that meet the AWC Employee Benefit Trust's stringent WellCity standards and demonstrate a commitment to employee health.

WellCity recipients are all part of the AWC Employee Benefit Trust (Trust), Washington State's largest local government employee health benefit pool for cities, towns, and other local governments. The Trust provides health benefits to more than 270 public entities and more than 36,000 employees and family members across the state. Employers that meet the WellCity standards earn a 2% discount on their medical premiums.

"The WellCity program provides a 2% discount on premiums. And because WellCity members have lower medical and prescription drug costs, the program benefits *all* Trust members by moderating premium rates for the pool. Over 85% of employees in the Trust are covered by a WellCity – that is a 10% increase over last year!" - Deanna Dawson, AWC CEO.

"I am very pleased that the City of DuPont continues to earn the AWC WellCity Award for promoting the health and well-being of city employees. With our miles of trails and community activities, the city also promotes the health and well-being of all city residents. Thank you to everyone in DuPont who helps us maintain a healthy lifestyle," said Mayor Ron Frederick.

AWC serves its members through advocacy, education, and services. Founded in 1933, AWC is a private, nonprofit, nonpartisan corporation that advocates on behalf of cities and towns and provides training and pooling programs such as the AWC Employee Benefit Trust. AWC created the AWC Employee Benefit Trust in 1969 to assist cities in meeting state-imposed medical coverage mandates for local law enforcement officers and fire fighters. 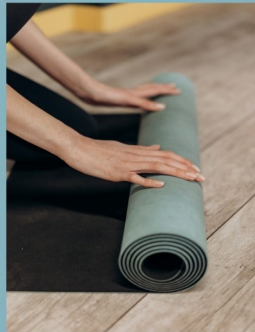

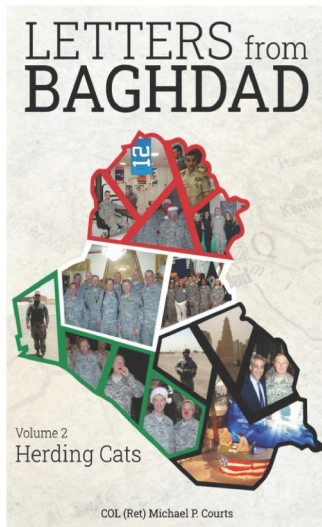

I-5 - Mounts Rd. to Steilacoom-DuPont Rd. Corridor Improvements

Beginning in late summer 2023, contractor crews working for the Washington State Department of Transportation will begin construction on Interstate 5 in DuPont near Joint Base Lewis-McChord. This is the third in a series of projects that widens I-5 to add HOV lanes between DuPont and Lakewood.

Improvements coming to DuPont and JBLM

In addition to extending the I-5 HOV lanes, construction crews will make improvements that enhance mobility and safety in DuPont and near the JBLM DuPont Gate at exit 119, including:

- A new bridge spanning I-5 and the railroad. The new bridge will feature a partial Diverging Diamond Interchange and a shared-use path for pedestrians and bicyclists between JBLM and DuPont.
- Direct access between JBLM and both directions of I-5.
- A new roundabout connecting Steilacoom-DuPont Road and the new overpass.

The project will also add a new signal at the intersection of the southbound I-5 off-ramp at Mounts Road (exit 116) and improve the I-5 vertical clearance over Pendleton Avenue.

What you can expect

Construction will begin in summer 2023 and is expected to be complete in 2026. The project consists of multiple stages that involve overnight and weekend ramp closures, lane shifts onto temporary pavement, potential speed limit reductions, and bicycle and pedestrian detours. Crews will contain dust and debris to the construction site and will minimize noise as much as practical. Clear signage will indicate required detours throughout the project.



The project extends HOV lanes in both directions into DuPont.

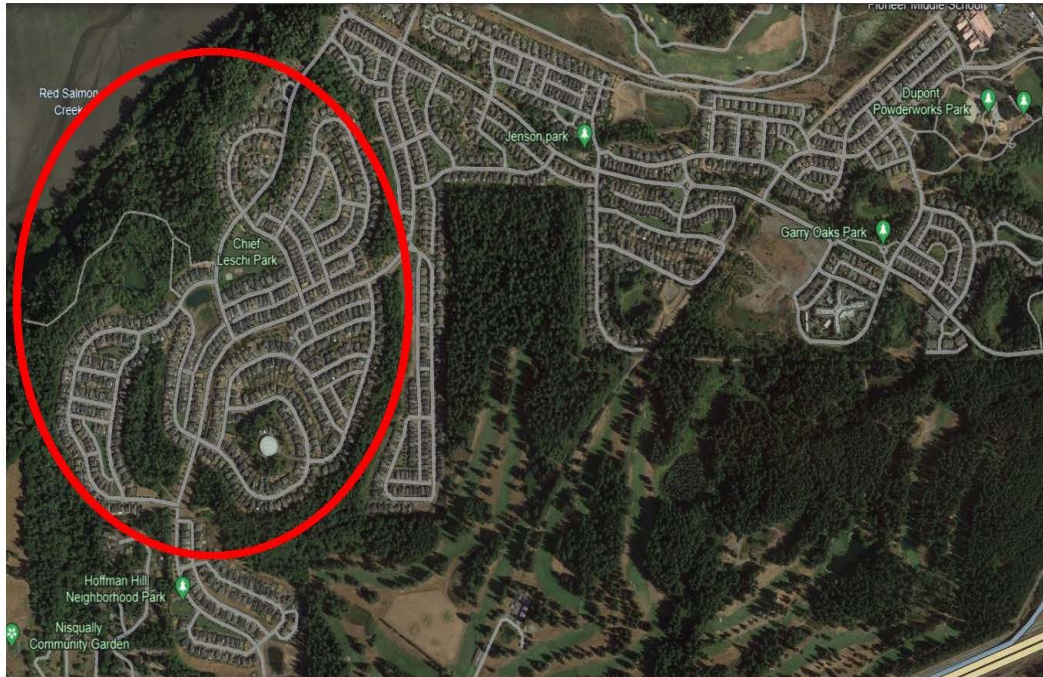

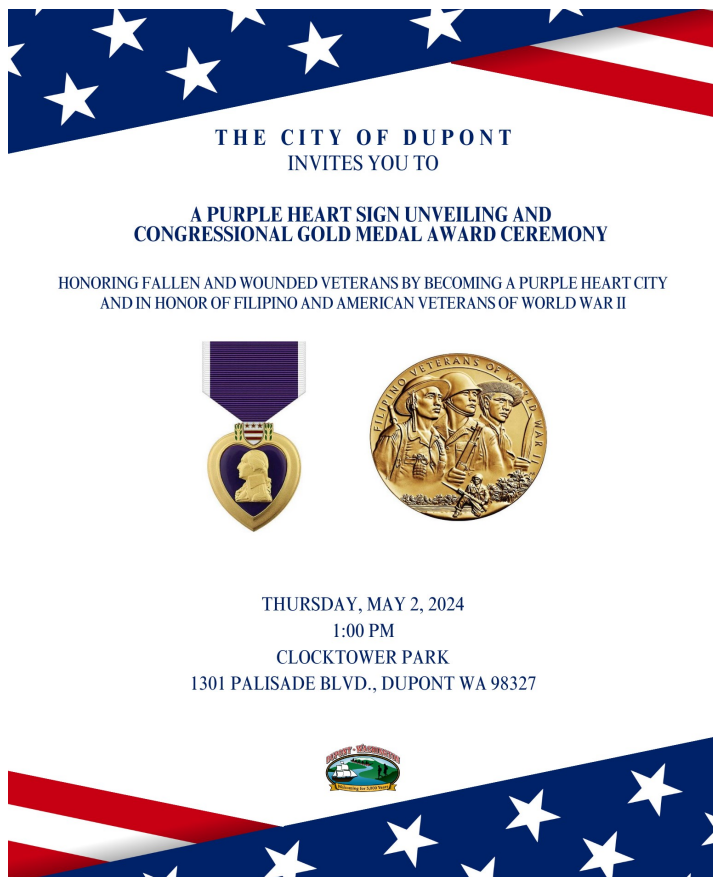

Safety Message - Spring ahead, with caution!

Here are some tips for the daylight-saving time change:

- Rest up: Go to bed earlier to get your usual amount of sleep so you can be well rested and alert.
- Defer the dangerous: Schedule particularly hazardous work later in the week (where possible) after employees have had more time to adjust their sleep schedules.
- Plan ahead: Give yourself extra time to drive to and from work, especially during the Monday commute, to avoid a potential accident.
- Step up the safety: Take extra safety precautions and assign extra safety monitors on days following the switch to help avoid potential workplace injuries before they occur.
- Change your Clocks, change your Batteries, Change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Be sure to practice your Home Fire Safety Exit Plan.
- Clean smoke alarms regularly by vacuuming them with a brush attachment.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years to achieve optimum performance.
