Dear Devoted,
First of all, thanks for being such a caring canine parent! As a dog myself, I have a special place in my heart for people like you. It sounds like you want Fido to live his best life, and while it may seem like a good idea to let him "run like someone left the gate open," that's not necessarily what's best for him. My advice to you is to keep Fido on his leash, and here's why:

- You can protect Fido from accidental ingestion of dangerous substances.
- You can control his speed, which reduces the chance of injury.
- You can keep him at a safe distance from other dogs or animals, who could potentially attack Fido.
- When Fido is under your control, he's less likely to get into something he's not supposed to.
- Take it from me - dogs like to chase! Bikes, squirrels, cars, etc. Keeping Fido on a leash protects everyone, including him.
- Just because Fido is friendly does not mean EVERY dog is friendly.
- And lastly, It's the law (which means you might be subject to fines - yikes!)
