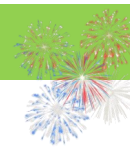

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS
FIREWORKS SAFETY IN DUPONT**

Q: When can I light off fireworks in DuPont?
A: The DuPont Municipal Code (DMC) 9.12.020 (a) states that fireworks are permitted within the city limits ONLY on the 4th of July between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:59 p.m.

Q: Can I light off fireworks in the street in front of my house?
A: Fireworks are NOT permitted on public property, such as (but not limited to) city streets, sidewalks, alleyways, and public parks. DMC 9.12.020 (b).

Q: What kind of fireworks can I use?
A: A list of both approved and illegal fireworks is provided by the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFM) of the Washington State Patrol (WSP) at the following link: www.wsp.wa.gov/fireworks/.

PER Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 70.77.136

Q: Who do I report fireworks complaints to?
A: All fireworks complaints should be made to the dispatch office of South Sound 911 (SS911). They can be reached via the non-emergency line at 253-287-4455 or 800-562-9800.

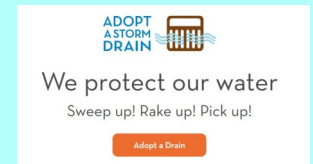
ADOPT A STORM DRAIN

Did you know storm drains feed directly into our local lakes and rivers, unfiltered? That's why it's so important to adopt a drain and keep them clear for cleaner and healthier water.

Here's how easy it is:

1. Find a drain to adopt near you at <https://adopt-a-drain.org/>
2. Name your drain. Bonus points for fun or creative drain names!
3. Take a few minutes to clean up the street and sidewalk near your drain if needed. Dispose of the debris properly (we show you how to do that too)
4. Report the amount you collect on your Adopt-a-Drain account
5. Repeat as necessary, we recommend about 2x/month
6. Email report to the City to publicworks@dupontwa.gov so we can say **Thank You** for helping out!!

Backflow Device Testing

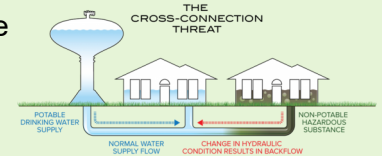
With warmer temperatures right around the corner, the City of DuPont's water division staff is focusing on backflow.

More than 1500 backflow devices are scheduled for testing during the months of March, April, May, and June, aligning with the start of the irrigating season.

Washington State DOH requires that ALL in-service backflow preventers be tested annually. (Whether in use or not).

Certified city staff are testing backflow devices to comply with Washington State regulations and to ensure our devices are ready should backflow conditions occur.

Thank you for doing your part to keep your neighborhood's water safe!





Why pick up after my dog?



1 Common Courtesy – When you take your pet off of your property, you are entering public shared space. It is the duty of pet owners to ensure that they pick up after their pets.

3 Your lawn mower doesn't help and in fact can make it worse – Mowers will actually chop up the waste into smaller pieces and spread it further throughout your yard where people continue to step in it and then bring it home.

2 Bacteria and parasites such as salmonella, fecal coliform, and giardia, can be spread by contact with infected dog waste – It can take up to one year for dog waste to completely decay, but even afterwards parasite eggs can linger for years in the soil – harmful for pets and humans.

4 It's Natural Like Cows, It's Fertilizer – Not True! This is a common misconception. Not all piles of poop are created equal (diets and digestive systems differ). Dog waste is so high in nitrogen and phosphorus that it can have the opposite effect of fertilizer.

5 Dog waste is considered a contributor to stormwater pollution – Dog poop left out can wash into storm drains, lakes, and streams, potentially harming aquatic life.

The Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) program works to reduce air pollution, traffic congestion, and fuel consumption by encouraging alternative transportation options throughout Washington State. The state requires jurisdictions to adopt a 4-year Commute Trip Reduction Plan every four years.

Input from the community, along with employers in Pierce County, is being sought to develop comprehensive CTR plans for jurisdictions in Pierce County. The goal is to develop strategies that address community needs and challenges and enhance mobility and quality of life for everyone.

The Steilacoom Historical School District will be changing the times for **school zone lights** in the City of DuPont effective May 6, 2024. Based on a review of other school district practices, and in an effort to create more consistency within the school district, school zone lights will be activated on the following schedule:

Chloe Clark Elementary

AM: 8:35 a.m. to 9:15 a.m.

PM: 3:25 p.m. to 4:05 p.m. (M, T, Th, F)

Wed PM: 2:25 p.m. to 3:05 p.m.

Pioneer Middle School (including Center Drive and Bob's Hollow Lane)

AM: 7:40 a.m. to 8:20 a.m.

PM: 2:30 p.m. to 3:10 p.m. (M, T, Th, F)

Wed PM: 1:30 p.m. to 2:10 p.m.

The intent of the changes is to have school zone lights activate in the morning 30 minutes before the start of school and stay on until 10 minutes after school starts. In the afternoon, the lights would activate 10 minutes before the end of school and stay on 30 minutes after the end of the school day. Whenever school is not in session, the district plans to deactivate the school zone lights, including during Spring Break, Winter Break, other scheduled non-school days, and snow days.

The district is working with the Town of Steilacoom to make similar changes in the near future.

Safety Message - Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, or odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call 9-1-1.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

Charging an E-bike

Charge your battery in a flat, dry area away from children, direct sunlight, liquids, tripping hazards, and in a location where the e-bike is not at risk of falling.
