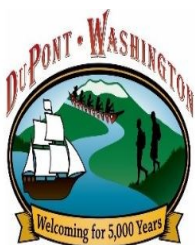
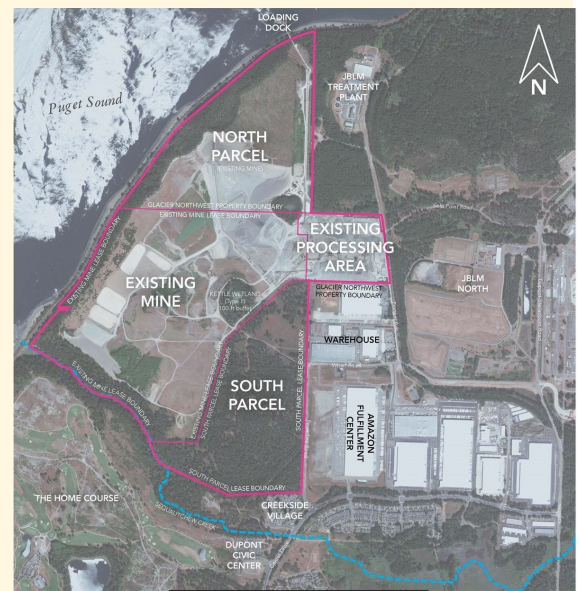
Pioneer Aggregates South Parcel Project - EIS Comment

City Hall Closure

City Hall will be closed on Wednesday, June 19th in observance of Juneteenth.

Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the [Emancipation Proclamation](https://www.history.com/news/what-is-juneteenth). Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday. On June 17, 2021, it officially became a federal holiday.

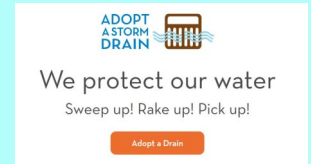
ADOPT A STORM DRAIN

Did you know storm drains feed directly into our local lakes and rivers, unfiltered? That's why it's so important to adopt a drain and keep them clear for cleaner and healthier water.

Here's how easy it is:

1. Find a drain to adopt near you at <https://adopt-a-drain.org/>
2. Name your drain. Bonus points for fun or creative drain names!
3. Take a few minutes to clean up the street and sidewalk near your drain if needed. Dispose of the debris properly (we show you how to do that too)
4. Report the amount you collect on your Adopt-a-Drain account
5. Repeat as necessary, we recommend about 2x/month
6. Email report to the City to publicworks@dupontwa.gov so we can say **Thank You** for helping out!!

Backflow Device Testing

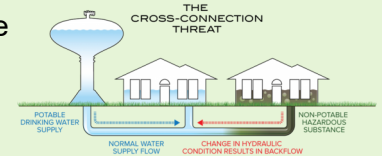
With warmer temperatures right around the corner, the City of DuPont's water division staff is focusing on backflow.

More than 1500 backflow devices are scheduled for testing during the months of March, April, May, and June, aligning with the start of the irrigating season.

Washington State DOH requires that ALL in-service backflow preventers be tested annually. (Whether in use or not).

Certified city staff are testing backflow devices to comply with Washington State regulations and to ensure our devices are ready should backflow conditions occur.

Thank you for doing your part to keep your neighborhood's water safe!





Why pick up after my dog?



- 1 Common Courtesy** – When you take your pet off of your property, you are entering public shared space. It is the duty of pet owners to ensure that they pick up after their pets.
- 2** Bacteria and parasites such as salmonella, fecal coliform, and giardia, can be spread by contact with infected dog waste – It can take up to one year for dog waste to completely decay, but even afterwards parasite eggs can linger for years in the soil – harmful for pets and humans.
- 3** Your lawn mower doesn't help and in fact can make it worse – Mowers will actually chop up the waste into smaller pieces and spread it further throughout your yard where people continue to step in it and then bring it home.
- 4** It's Natural Like Cows, It's Fertilizer – Not True! This is a common misconception. Not all piles of poop are created equal (diets and digestive systems differ). Dog waste is so high in nitrogen and phosphorus that it can have the opposite effect of fertilizer.
- 5** Dog waste is considered a contributor to stormwater pollution – Dog poop left out can wash into storm drains, lakes, and streams, potentially harming aquatic life.

Congratulations to our Class of 2024 graduates and their families!

We celebrated 235 Steilacoom High School graduates at our commencement ceremony on June 5th at St. Martin's University, which is a new venue for our school district's graduation event. Our community is incredibly proud of these graduates' achievements and we know they will do AMAZING things in the future.

- Forty-Nine (49) graduates attended their entire school career, kindergarten through 12th grade, within the Steilacoom Historical School District!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FIREWORKS SAFETY IN DUPONT

Q: When can I light off fireworks in DuPont?

A: The DuPont Municipal Code (DMC) 9.12.020 (a) states that fireworks are permitted within the city limits ONLY on the 4th of July between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:59 p.m.

Q: Can I light off fireworks in the street in front of my house?

A: Fireworks are NOT permitted on public property, such as (but not limited to) city streets, sidewalks, alleyways, and public parks. DMC 9.12.020 (b).

Q: What kind of fireworks can I use?

A: A list of both approved and illegal fireworks is provided by the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO) of the Washington State Patrol (WSP) at the following link: www.wsp.wa.gov/fireworks/.

Cylindrical Fountain, Helicopters, Aerial Spinners, Cone Fountain, Smoke Devices, Roman Candles, Parachutes, Wheels, Mine/Shell/Cakes, Ground Spinners, Reloadable Mortars, Dipped Stick, Sparkler, Novelties	Firecrackers, Skyrockets and Missiles, Bottle Rockets, M-80's, M-100's, Improvised Explosive Device (IED), Altered Fireworks

Q: Who do I report fireworks complaints to?

A: All fireworks complaints should be made to the dispatch office of South Sound 911 (SS911). They can be reached via the non-emergency line at 253-287-4455 or 800-562-9800.

FOR ALL IN-PROGRESS EMERGENCIES DIAL 9-1-1

Due to an Emergency Rule filed by the Washington State Building Code Council on March 15th, 2024, personal use Fireworks will not require a permit with in the City of DuPont.

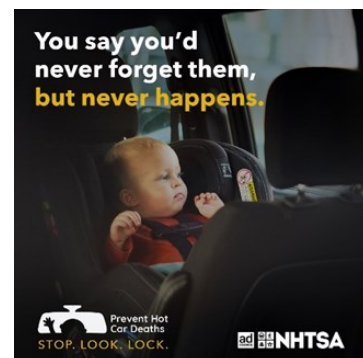

Safety Message - Everyone Can Help Prevent Hot Car Deaths

Parents and Caregivers

1. Never leave a child in a vehicle unattended for any length of time. Rolling windows down or parking in the shade does little to change the interior temperature of the vehicle.
2. Make it a habit to check your entire vehicle — especially the back seat — before locking the doors and walking away.
3. Ask your childcare provider to call if your child doesn't show up for care as expected.
4. Place a personal item like a purse or briefcase in the back seat, as another reminder to look before you lock. Write a note or place a stuffed animal in the passenger's seat to remind you that a child is in the back seat.
5. Store car keys out of a child's reach and teach children that a vehicle is not a play area.
