




# CITY OF DUPONT'S WEEKLY BITS & BYTES

## Friday, July 26, 2024

### Public Services

During the warm summer months, water production increases immensely, leading to increased staff resources to monitor the proper operation of our water facilities and system components. During these peak water demand periods, we tend to have more problems that require timely response and repairs to ensure adequate water pressure, flows and acceptable water quality.

Water Quality Specialist Justin Moore is seen troubleshooting the chlorine generator that provides water treatment at our Bell Hill Wells. This unit has been a bit finicky in recent weeks, and this has proven to be an around-the-clock task for staff as we are waiting for parts. At no time has the required residual dropped below acceptable levels.



Maintenance Worker 3, Scott Newton, is seen monitoring water system conditions with our telemetry system, which requires 24-7 monitoring and daily documentation for compliance to ensure safe drinking water and good system operation.



Maintenance worker 1, Dylan Thompson, is seen processing monitoring samples. The city is required to take several kinds of routine water samples for compliance monitoring year-round to ensure safe drinking water.





## Calling All Dinosaur Enthusiasts



## Safety Message - Preventing Mulch & Bark Dust Fires

Mulch or bark dust are combustible materials that can be easily ignited by improperly discarded smoking materials. Hundreds of fires are started this way every year. The risk is that what starts as a small outdoor mulch or bark dust fire can quickly spread to the building. If left unnoticed, a fire can be well underway before someone discovers it or is alerted by smoke alarms or sprinkler systems.

### Tips for Managers, Building Owners & Landscapers

- Recognize that when the weather is hot and there has been little or no rain for an extended time, mulch fires can start more readily.
- Provide approved receptacles for smoking materials at all entrances to public buildings, bus stops, and in designated smoking areas. Do not use mulch or bark dust in or near these areas.
- Provide a minimum of 18-inch clearance between landscape mulch or bark dust beds and combustible building materials, such as wood, vinyl siding and decks.
- Use non-combustible products such as river rock or pea gravel in high traffic areas, and around buildings.
- If mulch is preferred, avoid fresh wood mulches or bark dust. It's recommended to use non-combustible mulches such as stone, pavers, rock, decomposed granite or gravel.
- Keep landscaped mulch or bark dust beds moist, if possible.

### Dear Parents:

You have an important role in teaching children about fire safety. This activity book gives children valuable fire safety and prevention tips. To help your child become more aware of the information in this book, we encourage you to talk to them about fire safety and prevention. The tips below will help you:

- Make sure you have working smoke alarms on every level of your home. Put them inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.
- Test your alarms each month.
- Change batteries each year if you need to.
- Change your smoke alarms after 10 years.
- Make a family escape plan.
- Practice your plan at least twice a year.



When a fire starts, it is bright. But the smoke will make a room very dark. You may not be able to see.


#### Fire is deadly!
