NATIONAL PURPLE HEART DAY IS AUGUST 7, 2024

National Purple Heart Day is celebrated annually on August 7 to honor U.S. servicemembers who were wounded or killed as a result of enemy action while serving in the military. The Purple Heart is the oldest active military medal in the United States, with more than 1.8 million medals awarded to men and women who sacrificed for our nation.

On Aug. 7, 1782, George Washington established the award, originally called the Badge of Military Merit, to commend soldiers who secured victories in battle. Continental Army soldiers William Brown and Elijah Churchill were the first soldiers to receive the Badge of Military Merit.

One of the first military awards that could be presented to enlisted soldiers and non-commissioned officers, the Badge of Military Merit was reinstated on Washington's 200th birthday, Feb. 22, 1932, as the Purple Heart Medal and continues to be presented today to qualifying servicemembers.



Purple Heart Day was established in 2014 to honor and recognize those who have been awarded the decoration. The heart-shaped badge is purple because the color represents courage and bravery.

In honor of Purple Heart Day, the City of DuPont would like to honor and recognize the members of our military who bravely sacrificed for our nation.

Building Code Q & A:

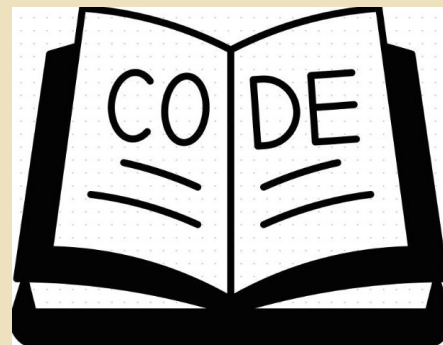
Question: If I re-roof my home, and the roof sheathing does not meet the current code requirements, does it need to be replaced?

Answer: No. As long as it met the adopted code at the time of construction and is in good condition, the roof sheathing does not need to be replaced.

Code Section: R4503.2.2 Existing Materials

Materials already in use in a building in compliance with requirements or approvals in effect at the time of their erection or installation shall be permitted to remain in use unless determined by the building official to be unsafe.

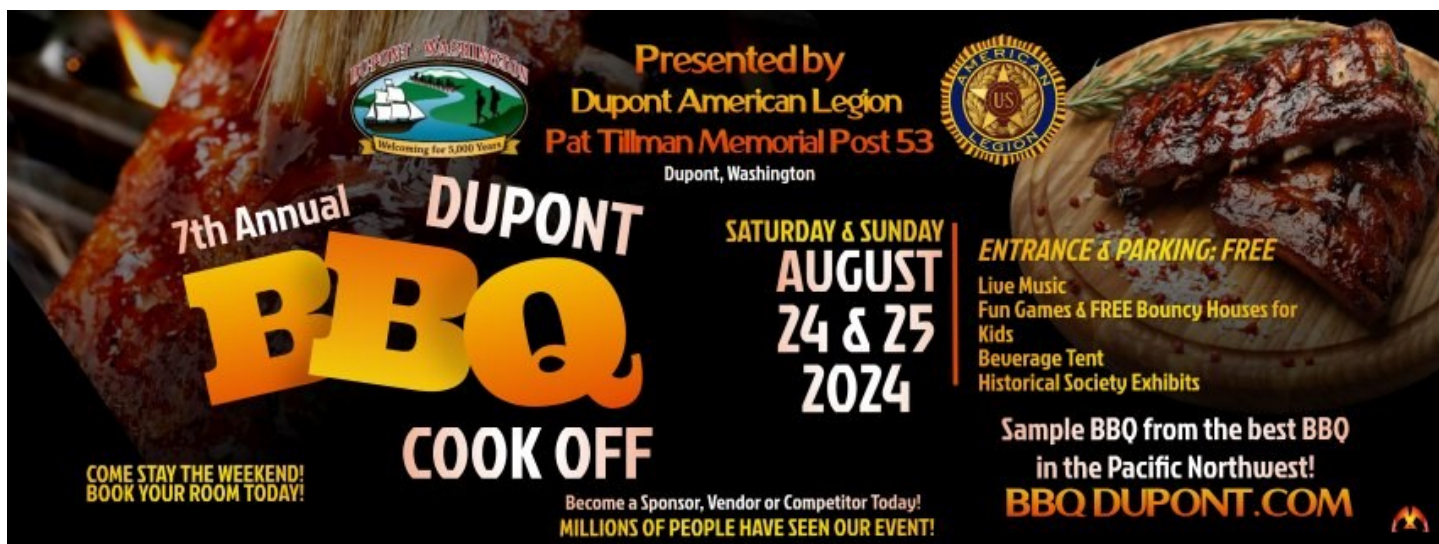

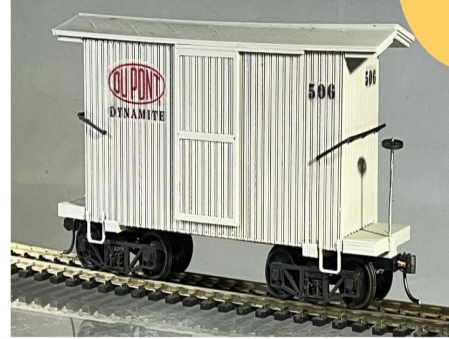

GUIDE TO EVACUATION LEVELS

A QUICK RESOURCE GUIDE

Emergency responders in Pierce County have worked together to develop a comprehensive disaster response plan to deal with emergencies and disasters of all kinds. When an emergency develops, responders may begin notifying residents by issuing **Evacuation Levels**.

It is important you and your family understand what the evacuation level terms mean and know how to react:

LEVEL 1 means BE ALERT Residents should be aware of the danger that exists in their area and monitor local media outlets for information. Residents with special considerations, such as health or mobility issues, or those with animals/pets, should take note and begin making arrangements to evacuate.

LEVEL 2 means BE READY This level indicates there is significant danger to your area and residents should either voluntarily relocate to family or friends outside of the affected area, or to a shelter location announced through local law enforcement and public media. If choosing to remain, be prepared to leave at a moment's notice.

THIS MAY BE THE ONLY EVACUATION NOTICE YOU RECEIVE!

LEVEL 3 means LEAVE IMMEDIATELY Danger to your area is current or imminent and you should leave immediately. Listen to local media and watch for emergency personnel who may be coming by to give further instructions regarding the evacuation.

During an emergency, listen to law enforcement and local media for information on the location of a shelter. Above all, remain calm. Know your escape routes in advance and you will be able to move quickly.
