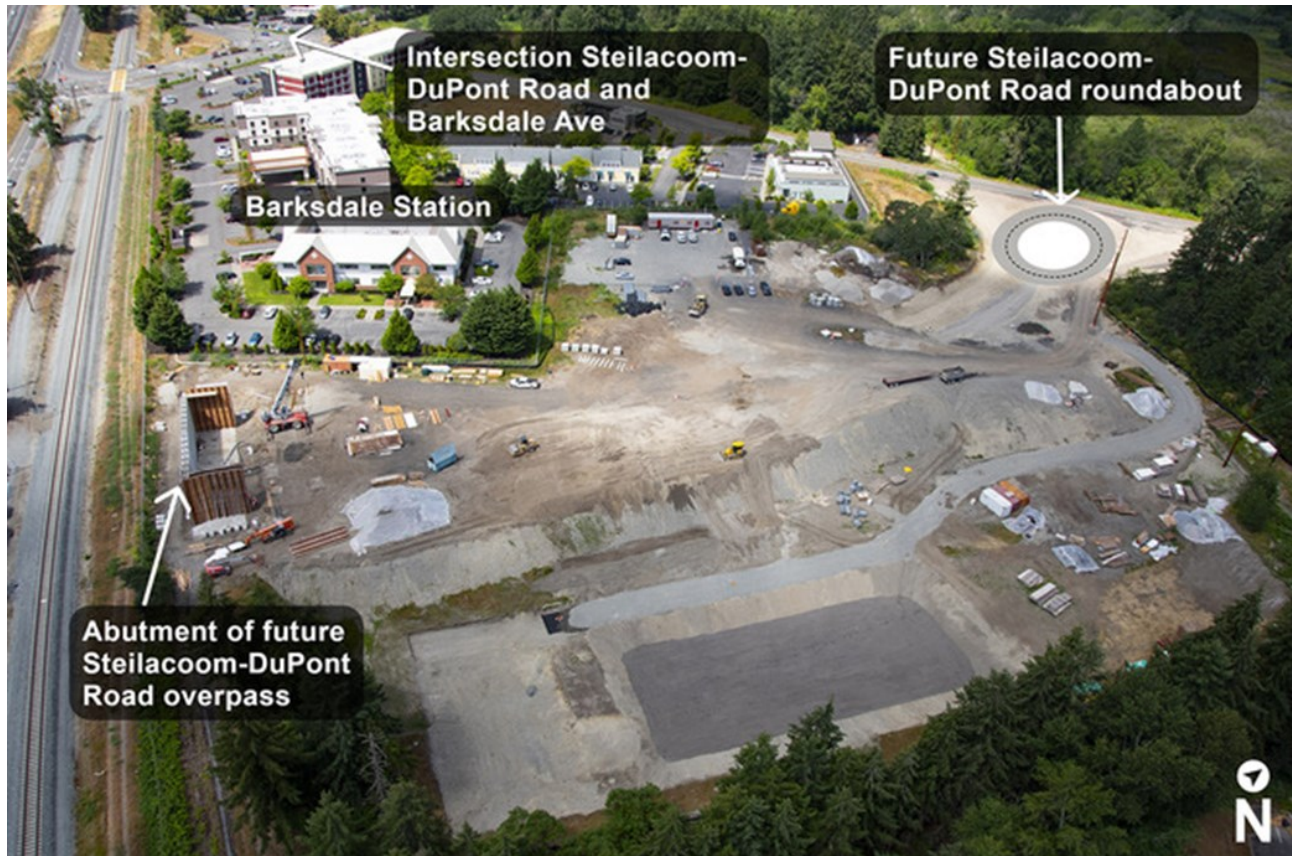
WSDOT: I-5 corridor improvements project near Joint Base Lewis-McChord hits one-year milestone and shifts into new stage



We're that much closer to a new and improved Interstate 5 near JBLM!

Since August 2023, construction crews have been working hard near DuPont. They have been constructing the foundations for major upgrades to I-5. There has been a lot of other work to improve how people get to the interstate and how they get onto the highway.

These improvements down the road will include a new overpass, extended HOV lanes in both directions of I-5, and a roundabout on Steilacoom-DuPont Road. More information is available via our [blog](#).



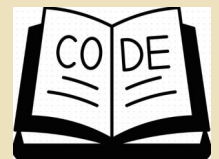
Building Code Q & A:

Question: If I re-roof my home, and the roof sheathing does not meet the current code requirements, does it need to be replaced?

Answer: No. As long as it met the adopted code at the time of construction and is in good condition, the roof sheathing does not need to be replaced.

Code Section: R4503.2.2 Existing Materials

Materials already in use in a building in compliance with requirements or approvals in effect at the time of their erection or installation shall be permitted to remain in use unless determined by the building official to be unsafe.

As soon as we learned about the amazing Imagination Library program, her parents signed her up. Now that she is almost three, she gets so excited about the monthly gift of a book, delivered straight to her mailbox. In fact, we are anxiously awaiting the arrival of two additional grandbabies this year and we will be sure to get both registered for Imagination Library immediately so they are able to experience the same mailbox joy!

Our school system absolutely understands the power of early literacy and have become partners with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program, which is a monthly "book-gifting program." Imagination Library mails high quality, age-appropriate books to children from birth to age five, at no cost to families. The National Commission on Reading states, "the single most significant factor influencing a child's early educational success is an introduction to books and being read to at home prior to beginning school."

Imagination Library of Washington also has excellent resources for families around early literacy topics, beyond the free book sent to children each month. The more we can spread the word about Imagination Library, and getting books into the little hands of our future kindergarteners, the better! Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) works to reduce air pollution, traffic congestion and fuel consumption by encouraging alternative transportation options other than driving alone throughout Washington State. Requirements are focused on employer-based programs that support employees in choosing non-drive alone commute options and reducing their drive-alone trips.

In the City of DuPont, we've sought input from our community members and employers to craft a detailed Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) plan. We're excited to share that these strategies, along with the draft Plan, are now available for public review and comment.

Safety Message - 12 Steps to Defend Your Home from Wildfire

Homes built in forests should have a minimum defensible space of 100 feet. If your home sits on a steep slope, standard protective measures may not suffice. Contact your local DNR Region Office or fire department/district for additional information.

- Rake leaves, dead limbs and twigs. Remove leaves and rubbish from under structures and remove vines from the walls of the home. Clear all flammable vegetation.
- Thin a 15-foot space between tree crowns, and remove limbs within 15 feet of the ground.
- Remove dead branches that extend over the roof.
- Prune tree branches and shrubs within 15 feet of a stovepipe or chimney outlet.
- Ask the power company to clear branches from powerlines.
- Mow grass regularly.
- Clear a 10-foot area around propane tanks and the barbecue. Place a screen over the grill - use nonflammable material with mesh no coarser than one-quarter inch.
- Regularly dispose of newspapers and rubbish at an approved site. Follow local burning regulations.
- Place stove, fireplace and grill ashes in a metal bucket, soak in water for 2 days; then bury the cold ashes in mineral soil.
- Store gasoline, oily rags and other flammable materials in approved safety cans. Place cans in a safe location away from the base of buildings.
- Stack firewood at least 100 feet away and uphill from your home. Clear combustible material within 20 feet.
- Review your homeowner's insurance policy and also prepare/update a list of your home's contents.

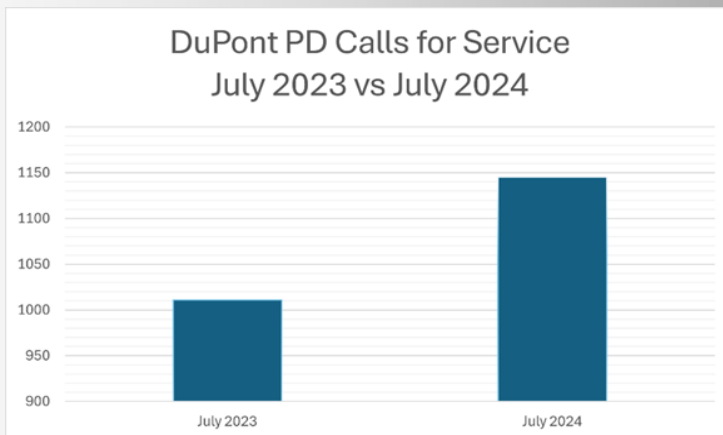
