#### **Mayor Frederick Nominates Deputy Police Chief Bryan Moore as Police Chief**

**DUPONT WA, August 14, 2024** - Mayor Frederick nominates Deputy Police Chief Bryan Moore as Police Chief of DuPont.

Deputy Chief Moore, a seasoned law enforcement veteran, has been with the City of DuPont since March 16, 2023. With a career spanning 25 years, he has honed his skills and expertise, serving most of his tenure with the Newport Beach (CA) Police Department, where he retired as a Lieutenant and the Executive Officer to the Chief of Police. Moore's journey in law enforcement began with the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD).

Deputy Chief Moore holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice Administration from California State University, Long Beach. He is also a graduate of the California Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute, the California POST Management Program, and Orange County's Leadership Tomorrow program.

Deputy Chief Moore replaces Douglas Newman, who recently took an Assistant Chief of Police position with the City of Fife. Deputy Chief Moore was appointed interim Police Chief after Mr. Newman's departure.

"We are thrilled to announce the nomination of Deputy Chief Moore to the role of Police Chief of DuPont. His exceptional leadership, unwavering positivity, and proactive approach have been evident in his work with the City over the past year," said Mayor Frederick.

The DuPont City Council will have the opportunity to ratify Deputy Chief Moore's nomination on August 27th.






## WSDOT: I-5 corridor improvements project near Joint Base Lewis-McChord hits one-year milestone and shifts into new stage

We're that much closer to a new and improved Interstate 5 near JBLM!



Since August 2023, construction crews have been working hard near DuPont. They have been constructing the foundations for major upgrades to I-5. There has been a lot of other work to improve how people get to the interstate and how they get onto the highway.

### Building Code Q & A:


**Question:** If I re-roof my home, and the roof sheathing does not meet the current code requirements, does it need to be replaced?

**Answer:** No. As long as it met the adopted code at the time of construction and is in good condition, the roof sheathing does not need to be replaced.

Code Section: R4503.2.2 Existing Materials

Materials already in use in a building in compliance with requirements or approvals in effect at the time of their erection or installation shall be permitted to remain in use unless determined by the building official to be unsafe.

Now that she is almost three, she gets so excited about the monthly gift of a book, delivered straight to her mailbox. In fact, we are anxiously awaiting the arrival of two additional grandbabies this year and we will be sure to get both registered for Imagination Library immediately so they are able to experience the same mailbox joy!

Our school system absolutely understands the power of early literacy and have become partners with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program, which is a monthly "book-gifting program." Imagination Library mails high quality, age-appropriate books to children from birth to age five, at no cost to families. The National Commission on Reading states, "the single most significant factor influencing a child's early educational success is an introduction to books and being read to at home prior to beginning school."

**Safety Message—Be Seen At Night**.....When it comes to traffic safety, knowledge can save lives and prevent injuries caused by accidents. The majority of motorist/pedestrian/cyclist accidents occur in the evening hours between dusk and 12 a.m., with a greater incidence on weekends. Here are a few tips on how to stay aware, visible, and safe on the road when the sun goes down.

**1. First and Foremost, Be Aware of Visibility Issues** - Understand that there are others on the road that may not be visible to you – and conversely, that others may not be able to see you. Take steps to become more visible at night and encourage others to do the same.

**2. Use Reflective Gear or Lights to Be Seen** - If walking or biking at night, wear white or light colors, use appropriate lighting on your bike, and always wear highly reflective gear which provides 360 visibility, (with visibility up to 1,500 feet).

**3. Walk and Bike in Well-Lit Areas** - Learn which roads and paths are adequately lit for safe nighttime walking and cycling and plan your route accordingly.

**4. Use Extra Caution in Crosswalks** - Motorists often have difficulty seeing someone in a crosswalk at night. Motorists should not presume the crosswalk is empty, cyclists should dismount and cross by foot and pedestrians should not presume the driver can see them in the crosswalk with-in a safe stopping distance, especially if dressed in dark colors. Accidents are most frequent during vehicle right turns.

**5. Share the Road, and Know Your Place on It** - Roads, sidewalks, and bike paths exist for a good reason – be sure you are where you belong.

**6. Know and Follow Traffic Laws** - Whether travelling by car, by bike, or on foot, know the rules of the road – particularly right-of-way laws. Cyclists should use appropriate signals and lanes, and pedestrians should only cross at official crosswalks.

**7. Visually Scan the Road for Vehicles and Pedestrians** - Keep alert at night by visually scanning your surroundings. Pedestrians should stop at the curb to view the road, and cyclists should look over their shoulder to see if the road is clear when turning.

## National Stop on Red Week

The first week of August is National Stop on Red Week, reminding drivers of the dangers of running a red light. The Federal Highway Administration (FHA) established National Stop on Red Week in 1995 to educate the public about the importance of stopping at red lights. This event is a nationwide reminder that stopping at red lights isn't just about avoiding a ticket but protecting lives from the severity of traffic collisions. The week is also intended to encourage drivers to prioritize road safety and obey traffic laws.

In 2022, according to the Insurance Industry for Highway Safety (IIHS), red light running resulted in the deaths of 1,149 people, and the injury of an estimated 107,000 people. Half of those killed were pedestrians, bicyclists and people in other vehicles who were hit by the red-light runners.

What can you do to protect yourself and loved ones from red light runners? Intersections can be dangerous — when the light turns green, look in all directions for red-light runners before proceeding whether driving, cycling or walking. Don't race through a yellow light! Know that a yellow light at an intersection should last long enough that a vehicle traveling at the posted speed can either: apply the brakes and comfortably and safely decelerate to a stop prior to reaching the front of the intersection or maintain the same speed and safely clear the intersection.

This Stop on Red Week, let's commit to obeying speed limits so you have time and space to stop prior to entering the intersection. Decide now that you will always be prepared to Stop on Red.
