#### City of DuPont Appoints New Chief of Police

**DUPONT WA, August 28, 2024** – The City of DuPont is pleased to announce the appointment of Bryan Moore as the new Chief of Police, effective September 1, 2024. Mayor Frederick nominated, and the City Council confirmed Moore as the next Police Chief for the City of DuPont at the August 27th City Council meeting.

Chief Moore brings a wealth of experience and a commitment to community-focused policing that aligns with the department's core values of duty, professionalism, and dedication.

Chief Moore has served as the department's Deputy Chief since March of 2023, where he has demonstrated exceptional leadership and dedication to enhancing public safety. Moore spent much of his career with the Newport Beach Police Department (CA), where he retired as a Lieutenant and Executive Officer to the Chief of Police. Moore began his career with the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) in 1999. With over 25 years in law enforcement, Chief Moore has been recognized for his commitment to community engagement and his ability to build strong, collaborative relationships between the police department and the community.

"I am honored to be appointed as the Chief of Police for DuPont," said Chief Moore. "I look forward to working collaboratively with our dedicated staff, community leaders, and residents to build on the successes of the department. 




## WSDOT: I-5 corridor improvements project near Joint Base Lewis-McChord hits one-year milestone and shifts into new stage

We're that much closer to a new and improved Interstate 5 near JBLM!

Since August 2023, construction crews have been working hard near DuPont. They have been constructing the foundations for major upgrades to I-5. There has been a lot of other work to improve how people get to the interstate and how they get onto the highway.

### Want to know how to make a public comment at a City Council Meeting?

#### Public Comment at City Council Meetings

The DuPont City Council provides opportunities for public comment at their meetings. The public can comment in various ways: in person, in writing, or remotely using audio / visual technology.

The public is welcome to attend meetings in person to make public comment and submit written comments, as has been allowed in the past. In addition, since 2020, the City of DuPont uses the Zoom platform for the public to attend meetings remotely.

The City Council has recently made changes to the City Council Rules of Procedure, revised on July 9, 2024, regarding making public comment remotely using audio / visual technology. The recent change requires requesting access prior to the meeting.

To provide public comment using Zoom, send an email to the City Clerk ([kmuir@dupontwa.gov](mailto:kmuir@dupontwa.gov)) no later than 10:00 A.M. on the meeting day. Include the following in the email request: the first and last name, the phone number that will be used to call in, and the email address of the caller. Also identify the agenda item (s) the caller wishes to speak about (Public Comment, near the beginning of the meeting; New Business, if there is new business listed on the agenda; and / or Public Hearing, if there is a public hearing listed on the agenda).

A request for remote access can be made after 10:00 A.M. on a meeting day only when an explanation of why the deadline of 10:00 A.M. could not be met. In these cases, the City Clerk or the Mayor may deny the late request at their discretion.

Instructions with the Zoom link, the meeting ID, and password will be sent to the provided email address prior to the start of the meeting. (Requests for access directed to any City official or employee other than the City Clerk, shall be denied.)

## Safety Message - Back to School Safety

### Walking to school:

- Walk on the sidewalk, if one is available; when on a street with no sidewalk, walk facing the traffic.
- Before crossing the street, stop and look left, right and left again to see if cars are coming.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing the street and always cross streets at crosswalks or intersections.
- Stay alert and avoid distracted walking. Never walk while texting. If you need to respond to a text, move out of the way of others and stop on the sidewalk. Never cross the street while using an electronic device. Do not wear earbuds while walking across the street.

### Riding a bike to school:

- Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic, and in single file.
- Come to a complete stop before crossing the street; walk bikes across the street.
- Stay alert and avoid distracted riding.
- Make sure your child always wears a properly fitted helmet and bright clothing.
- Helmets appropriate for bicycling should be worn by everyone – adults and children – on every bike ride regardless of length of the ride.
