NEWS FROM PATROL

Officers responded to a call at a local business for an unwanted customer. After confirming the identity of the customer, it was discovered that he had a warrant from Lakewood Police Department for False Reporting in the 3rd Degree. During a frisk search, a syringe was found in the customer's clothing. If the contents of the syringe test positive for methamphetamine, additional charges will be referred to the Prosecutor. The customer was arrested for his warrant and booked into jail.

A female contacted officers at the police station to report a domestic violence incident. After interviewing the victim and suspect, it was determined that charges would be filed against the suspect for Assault in the 2nd Degree and Unlawful Imprisonment. The suspect was arrested and booked into jail.
