### PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, in 2024, an estimated 310,720 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in U.S. women, and 42,250 will die from the disease; and

**WHEREAS**, breast cancer accounts for 12.5% of all new annual cancer cases worldwide, making it the most common cancer in the world; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2024, an estimated 2,790 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in men; and

**WHEREAS**, the American Cancer Society and its affiliates support those patients currently battling breast cancer, as well as those who have lost their lives to the disease and are committed to nothing less than a cure; and

**WHEREAS**, the good health and well-being of the residents of DuPont are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about breast cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments; and

**WHEREAS**, there are ways to lower your risk for breast cancer, which include staying at a healthy weight, engaging in physical activity several times per week, and limiting or avoiding alcohol; and

**WHEREAS**, every year, too many people are touched by the pain and hardship caused by breast cancer, and the City of DuPont supports these individuals and their families and commits to continue working toward a future free from cancer in all its forms.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the City of DuPont hereby proclaims October as

### Breast Cancer Awareness Month

to honor those who have lost their lives to breast cancer, recognize the courageous women and men who are living with this disease, and celebrate breast cancer survivors.

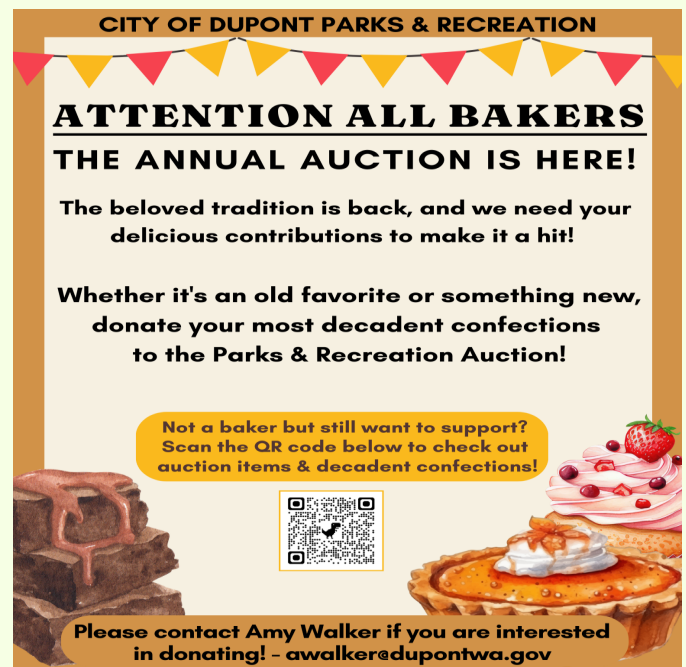

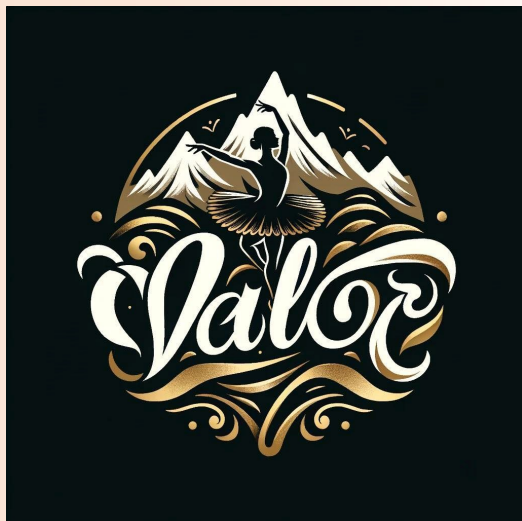

**MULTIPLE VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES!** The City of DuPont is looking for citizens to fill vacant positions on the Park & Recreation Commission and the Tree Advisory Commission.

**Park & Recreation Commission** - The purpose of the Park and Recreation Commission is to advise the City Council on various parks and recreation issues, including the capital facilities plan, land acquisition, park development, park facilities and recreation programs, and other matters as directed by the City Council. The Park and Recreation Commission also collaborates with the Planning Commission as needed on matters relating to parks elements of the comprehensive plan. The Park and Recreation Commission currently has several filled positions that will expire at the end of 2024.

**Tree Advisory Commission** - The Tree Advisory Commission advises and provides information to the Mayor and City Council on matters relating to urban forestry and helps the city meet the requirements of the [Tree City USA program](#). The Tree Advisory Commission currently has a vacant position and two that are currently filled but will expire at the end of 2024.

## Around the Town – September 2024

We value the importance of early childhood education programming. Pre-kindergarten programs have a significant impact on a child's emotional, cognitive, and social development. Research indicates that access to high quality, early childhood education offers a range of long-term benefits, including improved readiness for school.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is a legislatively established early learning program for children who are at least 4 years old by August 31 and have been identified through a screening process to be in need of additional preparation to be successful kindergarten students in the following school year. TK is free for families and TK teachers focus on essential academics, social-emotional skills, and learning habits for children as they begin their academic journey.

We are thrilled to be offering Transitional Kindergarten (TK) at Anderson Island Elementary School this year. We are also exploring the option of offering TK at Cherrydale Primary School and Chloe Clark Elementary School, beginning in November, depending on enrollment capacity.

We have created a TK informational page on our district website, which includes an interest form for families to complete if considering TK. Offering a pre-kindergarten, early learning program has been a dream of ours for many years and we are excited for the possibility of offering this learning experience for the children of our community.

## Safety Message - Fire Prevention Week, October 6-12, 2024

The National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) announced "Smoke alarms: make them work for you!™" as the official theme for [Fire Prevention Week™](#), October 6–12, 2024. [NFPA announces 2024 Fire Prevention Week Theme](#)

**Key messages for this year's Fire Prevention Week theme, "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!" include the following:**

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- Make sure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or don't respond when tested.

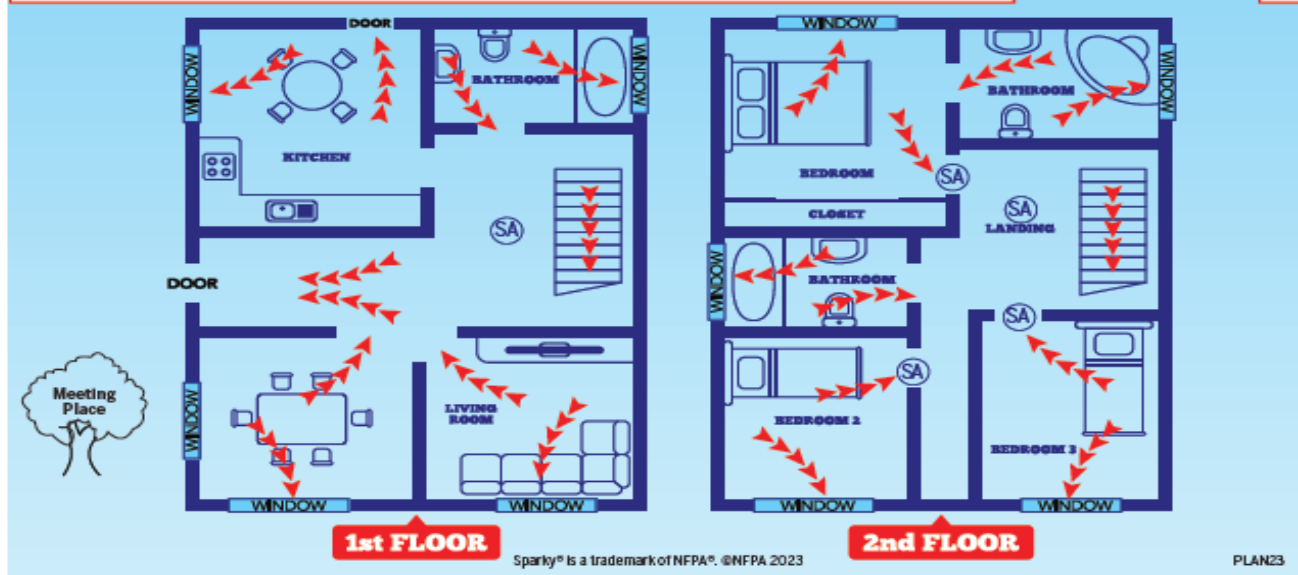

- ☐ Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- ☐ Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- ☐ All windows and doors open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- ☐ Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- ☐ Pick an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- ☐ The house or building number can be seen from the street.
- ☐ Make sure your plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- ☐ Everyone in the home should know the fire department's emergency number and how to call once they are safely outside.
- ☐ Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

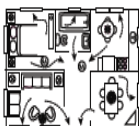

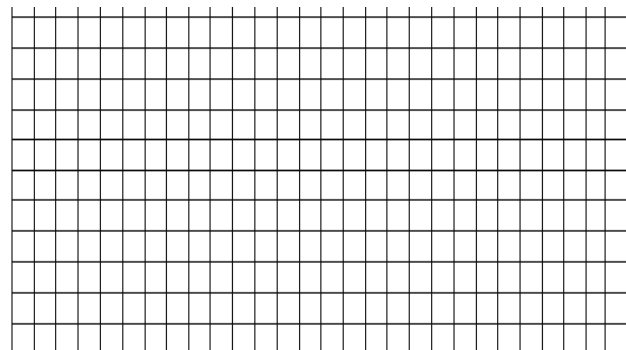

Meeting Place

- Draw a floor plan or a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- Mark two ways out of each room.
- Mark all of the smoke alarms with (SA). Smoke alarms should be in each sleeping room, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home.
- Pick a family meeting place outside where everyone can meet.
- Remember, practice your plan at least twice a year!



**Grown-ups:** Children don't always wake up when the smoke alarm sounds. Know what your child will do before a fire occurs.

# City Council and Calendars

## Tuesday, September 24, City Council Meeting overview:

- Mayor Frederick proclaimed the month of October as “Breast Cancer Awareness Month” in the City of DuPont.
- Study session - Fire Chief Gillie presented the Fire Code official review, inspection and Fire Code fees.
