

I-5 - Mounts Rd. to Steilacoom-DuPont Rd. - Corridor Improvements


Maintenance I-5 both directions: Overnight and early morning lane closures on I-5 near Dupont Nov. 19-21.

REMOVAL OF ELECTION SIGNS

Did you know that the DuPont Municipal Code (DMC) requires political signs be removed within five (5) working days following an election? **With the election on November 5th, signs were required to be picked up by November 13th.**

If you or someone you know posted a sign during this election, please act responsibly and pick it up.

The Public Works crews have started collecting them and it's a big job.

Signs will be placed on the right side of the gateway entry to the Public Works site in the Historic Village, located at 301 Forcite Street, DuPont. If they are not picked up in a timely manner, the city will have to dispose of them.

Avoid injury and a repair bill by contacting 811 before you dig

More than 40% of people don't contact 811 because they think their project is too shallow to require it. Before doing any kind of digging in your yard, call 811 because underneath your lawn may rest a variety of buried utilities.

Simple gardening projects like planting a tree, removing tree roots, staking tomatoes or installing a retaining wall all require a call to 811. Hitting a buried line can not only cost money to repair but could cause serious injury.

No matter the size of your project, be safe and contact 811 at least two business days (not counting the day you call) before you do any project to have the location of buried utilities marked for free. Learn more at digsafewa.com.

Your safety is our top priority. At Puget Sound Energy, we want to make sure you and your family are safe and sound in your home and business. That's why we're committed to maintaining a reliable and secure natural gas system.

We're always on the lookout for potential issues, monitoring our system 24/7, 365 days a year. Our team of experts, along with our partner Hydromax USA, regularly inspect every inch of our gas mains and services, from the street to your gas meter. We use sensitive equipment to detect any leaks or problems, and we always meet or exceed regulatory requirements.

But leaks can happen in places that we can't get to – inside your home. That's why a special odorant, called mercaptan, is added to natural gas, to give it a distinct sulfur or rotten egg smell, though it may smell differently to you.

If you suspect a gas leak indoors, please follow these simple steps:

- Leave the area immediately and call us at 1-888-CALL-PSE or dial 911. We'll send a technician right away, for free!
- Don't flip any switches or try to investigate - this could cause a spark.
- Don't open windows to vent the air.

You can also keep an eye out for signs of a gas leak outdoors, such as:


- Bubbles escaping through a puddle.
- Dead vegetation where you wouldn't expect it.
- Dirt blowing up from the ground.

If you notice any of these signs, please give us a call. For more information or to request a gas safety brochure with a mercaptan scratch-n-sniff, go to pse.com/detectaleak.

Call PSE before clearing a blocked sewer line

If your sewer is blocked beyond the walls of your house, call PSE when your plumber is on their way to clear it. Or have your plumber call. Some natural gas lines have inadvertently been installed through sewer and septic lines, causing a cross bore. Clearing the pipes with a cutting tool could break the gas line, allowing gas into your house and creating a dangerous situation.

PSE will meet your plumber on-site – for free – and ensure the sewer or septic line is safe to clear. This can happen to homes not served by natural gas. Don't take a chance. Before your plumber clears an exterior blockage, either you or your plumber should call PSE at 1-888-225-5773. Learn more at pse.com/sewersafety.

Safety Message: November is Carbon Monoxide (CO) Awareness Month

Check your CO detectors:
Ensure your carbon monoxide detectors are working properly and placed according to manufacturer instructions, typically outside each sleeping area and on every floor.

Inspect fuel-burning appliances:
Schedule annual inspections of furnaces, fireplaces, water heaters, and other fuel-burning appliances to check for potential CO leaks.

Never use generators indoors:
Always operate generators outdoors in a well-ventilated area, away from windows and doors.

Proper ventilation:
Ensure adequate ventilation when using gas appliances like ovens, stoves, and fireplaces.

Be aware of symptoms:
Recognize signs of CO poisoning like headache, nausea, dizziness, fatigue, and confusion, and seek medical attention immediately if you suspect exposure.

NEWS FROM PATROL

- Officers provide additional security checks in the area of the ballot box during the election.
- Assistance was requested by dispatch for a DuPont officer to locate a vehicle that was reported on the railroad tracks at Station Drive. The vehicle was located, and the driver was safely removed from the vehicle. Pierce County Deputies arrested the driver for DUI.
- Officers responded to a verbal domestic violence incident. After interviewing one of the individuals involved, the other half was found to have damaged property in the home. As a result, charges were referred to the prosecutor for Malicious Mischief in the 3rd Degree.
- An officer stopped a speeding driver for driving 71 miles per hour in a 35 mile per hour speed zone.
- Officers were dispatched to a report of a juvenile that was found to have narcotics. Charges were referred to the prosecutor.
- Multiple items were dumped on private property next to a local business. This is an ongoing issue and is under investigation.
- A local business reported a burglary. Individuals entered the building by prying open a lock. This incident is under investigation.
- Officers received a report of several juveniles that were heard talking about placing a rock on the railroad tracks in an attempt to derail a train. The juveniles were located.
