Proper drainage: rain, leaves, and FOG

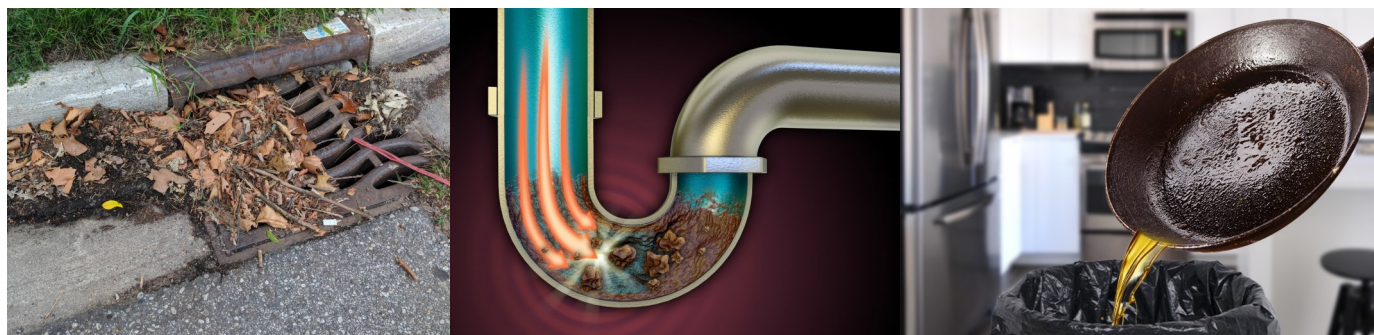
Sewer and stormwater cleaning and maintenance is a year-round task. However, this time of year it is more important than ever. The fall and winter rain can overwhelm stormwater drains with dead leaves and washed away debris, leading to flooding and property damage. Be sure you know the locations where deciduous trees and stormwater drains overlap and conduct frequent clearing in the area and street cleaning to prevent leaves and debris from clogging.

Fats, oils, and grease – FOG tips

Holiday season feasts mean potential fats oils and grease (FOG) into sewer lines, causing backups and breaks. All of this is exacerbated by cold weather, freezing pipes, frozen drains, and faster cooling and coagulating of FOGs. Stay ahead of these risks with these tips!

- ✦ Never put FOGs down drains, toilets or sewers.
- ✦ Scrape FOG and food scraps from pots, pans, and dishes and dispose of them in the trash.
- ✦ Use sink strainers to catch food items before they reach pipes and sewer lines.
- ✦ FOGs can be placed in a disposable container to cool and solidify and then put in the trash.

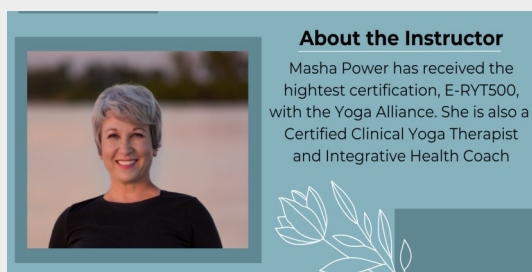

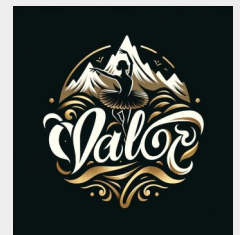

Safety Message: Thanksgiving Fire Statistics:

- Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires with more than three times the daily average for such incidents. Christmas Day and Christmas Eve ranked second and third, with both having nearly twice the daily average.
- Unattended cooking was by far the leading contributing factor in cooking fires and fire deaths.
- Cooking causes half (52%) of all reported home fires and nearly two of every five (36%) home fire injuries, and it is a leading cause of home fire deaths (17%).
- On Thanksgiving day alone, an estimated 1,610 home cooking fires were reported to U.S fire departments in 2022, reflecting a 399 percent increase over the daily average.





Thanksgiving Safety

The kitchen is the heart of the home, especially at Thanksgiving. Kids love to be involved in holiday preparations. Safety in the kitchen is important, especially on Thanksgiving Day when there is a lot of activity and people at home.

- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children — up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

Did you know?



Thanksgiving is the leading day of the year for home fires involving cooking equipment.

Have activities that keep **kids out of the kitchen** during this busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done **outside** the kitchen.

NEWS FROM PATROL

- Parking enforcement was conducted in the palisade area.
- Assistance was requested from Washington State Patrol for DuPont officers to help locate an individual driving south on I-5 who claimed they had an occupant in the vehicle who had a gun and was trying to steal the vehicle. DuPont officers located an unoccupied vehicle with the engine running on the southbound ramp of Exit 118. The driver was located walking near a local hotel. It was determined that there were no other occupants in the vehicle. The driver appeared to be overwhelmed with personal issues and requested a friend to pick them up.
- An officer was dispatched to a local business for multiple vehicles that were broken into overnight.
- Officers responded to a possible suicide attempt. Following an interview with the person and their spouse, officers determined that this was a verbal domestic violence incident.

Vehicle Break-In & Theft Prevention



Crimes of opportunity are easily preventable!

LOCK YOUR VEHICLE

Locking your vehicle doors is the first step in deterring a thief.

REMOVE YOUR KEYS

If your key is in the ignition, a thief can simply break a window and drive off. Never leave your vehicle running without someone in it.

CLOSE YOUR WINDOWS

Keep your windows closed completely. A thief can easily reach into your car through an open window

PARK IN WELL-LIT AREAS OR GARAGE

Thieves may be deterred if they know they can easily be seen.

DON'T LEAVE VALUABLES IN YOUR CAR

One way to attract a thief is to leave a purse or wallet, cell phone, laptop, or other high value item in a visible area of your car. If you must leave items in your vehicle hide them where they can't be easily seen.

BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS

If you're concerned about the safety of your vehicle or spot someone prowling around the area, park somewhere else if possible.
