
## City News

## SNOW & ICY ROAD CONDITIONS INFORMATION

**When does the City Sand/Plow?** Spot spreading of sand and/or salt is the first step of the City's snow and ice control. This is done to provide reasonable driving surfaces in the winter road conditions. Drivers should always use caution while driving when snow or icy conditions are present. Plowing typically begins when two or more inches of snow has accumulated on the roads. Primary routes will always have the first priority, with hills and intersections on primary routes plowed first.




**What streets have priority to be plowed?** The Public Works Crew plows main streets to allow citizens access to services and to help provide access for Fire, Police and emergency services. Hills, curves, bridges and intersections on these routes will receive treatment first. When primary routes are treated and safe for travel, snow plows then move to secondary routes and may address residential streets, however, depending on the severity of the event, residential streets may not be plowed for some time. See the route map below for primary route information.

**Should I pass a snow plow?** No, not if it is plowing the road. They are making the roadway safer for you to travel on. Remember to stay a safe distance – at least 3 car lengths behind the snow plow.



**How do I report a hazardous roadway?** Call the Public Works Department at (253) 964-8121 during regular business hours, or for after hours emergencies, please call (253) 912-5389.

***It's simple to report an issue!***

1. On the City's website ([www.dupontwa.gov](http://www.dupontwa.gov)), under the carousel of pictures, click on "Report a Concern/Compliment."
2. Under "Other important numbers," choose "Street Light Outages- [Puget Sound Energy](#)."
3. Complete the PSE form and, for best assistance, enter the pole number (see picture to the left as an example). This will direct PSE to the exact pole that is experiencing an outage so they can address the issue.


## Savvy Seniors

## Put a **FREEZE** on Winter Fires

Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!



Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.



Heating equipment is involved in **1 in every 6** home fires and **1 in every 5** home fire deaths.



Keep anything that can burn **at least 3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.



Keep portable generators **outside, away from windows, and as far away** from your home as possible.



Install and test carbon monoxide alarms **at least once a month**.



Plug only **1 heat-producing appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.



Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year**.



Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it **outside at least 10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.

### NEWS FROM PATROL

- A local gas station reported that juveniles were causing disruption inside the business and playing with the gas pumps. Officers located the juveniles and contacted their parents.
- Officers assisted the DuPont Fire Department at a local business for an elevator that had stopped working with occupants inside. All occupants were rescued once an elevator technician arrived on scene and opened the doors. No injuries were reported.
- Numerous vehicles throughout the city were marked with warnings for being improperly parked.
- Officers responded to multiple reports of possible shots fired in the historic village and Sequalitchew Creek trail area. No individuals or shell casings were found.
- Officers responded to a report of a verbal domestic violence incident. The reported victim stated they jumped from a moving vehicle and were hiding in a bush to get away. The victim then contacted a resident asking for help. After officers arrived, it was determined that the victim's phone had been broken and they had been threatened with physical violence by the individual they were with. As a result, recommended charges for harassment and malicious mischief were forwarded to the prosecutor.
- An individual was reported to be outside of the police station requesting assistance due to having suicidal thoughts and possible intentions of harming others. After speaking with an officer, the individual was voluntarily transported to a hospital.
- Officers were dispatched to a physical domestic violence incident between spouses. After interviewing both individuals, one spouse was arrested and booked into jail for Assault in the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree.
