NEWS FROM PATROL

- Officers responded to the report of an accidental shooting. When officers arrived, they found an individual lying on the floor of their home with a gunshot wound to the leg. The accidental discharge occurred while the firearm was being cleaned. An officer provided first aid while waiting for the fire department to arrive. The individual was transported to the hospital.
- Speed emphasis was conducted on Center Drive and Steilacoom DuPont Road resulting in numerous traffic stops.
- Officers assisted Washington State Patrol with locating a vehicle involved in a possible road rage.
- A vehicle with expired registration tabs was stopped by an officer while on patrol. During the stop, it was determined that the driver was operating the vehicle with a suspended license. The driver was arrested and released at the scene. A charge for Driving While Suspended in the 2nd Degree was referred to the prosecutor.
