## WA State Dept. of Transportation

### I-5 - Mounts Rd. to Steilacoom-DuPont Rd. - Corridor Improvements

- No work scheduled News Years Eve and New Years Day.
- Travelers on Joint Base Lewis-McChord who use Pendleton Avenue below I-5 are encouraged to plan for a series of night closures. People can expect night lane closures as early at 7 p.m. between Center Drive and 41st Division Drive. The lane closures generally are planned each Monday through Thursday night.
- 9 p.m. to 4 a.m. each following day through Monday, Jan. 6:
  - ⇒ Pendleton Avenue between West Way and Main Street will close.
  - ⇒ A signed detour will be provided.
- Crews have created a new work zone in the I-5 median. The new work zone allows crews to build new northbound and southbound I-5 HOV lanes.
- Work also continues on a new I-5 bridge over Pendleton Avenue. Crews also will continue building a new Steilacoom-DuPont Road interchange and a connecting roundabout from Steilacoom-DuPont Road.
- Ramps will close no earlier than 7 p.m. and will reopen by 4:30 a.m. the next morning. No more than two consecutive ramps will close at a time. A signed detour will direct drivers to the next nearest on- or off-ramp.
- Crews are building a new traffic signal at the southbound I-5 exit to Mounts Road. The traffic signal will be activated during late 2025.

## **Safety Message: Fire safety tips to keep in mind after Christmas**

- Take down wrapping paper and other decorations from around your tree, fireplace, and heating vents.
- Have your dried-out tree picked up as soon as possible. Don't leave it in your garage or leaning against your house.
- Test your smoke alarms and make sure everyone knows your home's fire escape plan.
- Turn off all lights before you leave the house or go to bed.
- Keep them out of reach of children and in a locked cabinet.
- Water a live tree every day to prevent it from drying out and becoming brittle.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Don't burn wrapping paper in your fireplace, recycle it.

### NEWS FROM PATROL

- While on patrol, an officer contacted an individual at a local business. The individual was found to have a misdemeanor warrant from the Auburn Police Department. The individual was arrested and transferred to an Auburn officer.
- A speed emphasis was conducted on Center Drive and Steilacoom DuPont Road. A driver was cited for driving 69 miles per hour in a 45 mile per hour speed zone. Three drivers were cited for not possessing a driver's license.
- An officer responded to a report of employees on strike at a local business, possibly causing traffic concerns.
- Officers assisted neighboring agencies with locating a wanted individual who may be on a bus that was scheduled to stop in DuPont. After searching the bus upon its arrival in DuPont, the individual was not found.
- An officer observed two individuals at a local business who were having issues with their vehicle. After obtaining the identities of the individuals, it was discovered that one of them had a felony warrant from the Puyallup Police Department. The individual was arrested and transferred to a Puyallup officer.
- Theft of a vehicle from a residential area in DuPont was reported to officers. A crime in a nearby city was committed using the stolen vehicle.
