The #1 tip for winter driving safety: SLOW DOWN!

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>CHECK UP</u></p> <p>Ensure your defroster, wiper blades, lights, battery and brakes are working properly.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>TRACTION READY</u></p> <p>Carry chains. Be sure tires are properly inflated and tread is good.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>DRIVE SLOWLY</u></p> <p>Reduce your speed to offset the traction lost due to wet and icy surfaces.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>CHARGE UP</u></p> <p>Be sure your mobile phone is fully charged and bring any additional chargers.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON</u> <u>RCW 46.37.420</u></p> <p>Studded tires may only be used between November 1 and April 1.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>FILL UP</u></p> <p>Check your fuel, windshield wiper fluid and antifreeze. Top off anything that is running low.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>AVOID DISTRACTIONS</u></p> <p>When driving, give your full attention to the road. Avoid distractions like eating or using your cell phone.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>BE INFORMED</u></p> <p>Check the weather, road conditions and travel cameras.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>INCREASE DISTANCE</u></p> <p>Increase following distance, vehicles need more distance to stop on wet and icy roads. Stay 200 meters from snow plows.</p>
