NEWS FROM PATROL

- An officer pulled over a vehicle after the driver failed to stop at a stop sign. After speaking with the driver and conducting a Field Sobriety Test and breath test, it was determined that the driver was intoxicated. The driver was arrested for Driving Under the Influence (DUI).
- Officers were dispatched to a verbal domestic violence incident that was in progress. When officers arrived on scene, one of the individuals involved had left the residence. Officers observed damage to the residence and several items in the home. The individual that left the residence earlier returned home and was arrested on the charge of Malicious Mischief in the 3rd Degree.
- A welfare check was requested for an individual whose family members were unable to contact. The individual was found in their home deceased of natural causes.
- A driver was pulled over by an officer twice on the same day for driving 60 and 66 miles per hour in a 35 zone on Center Drive.
