NEWS FROM PATROL

- Officers responded to four separate physical domestic violence incidents.
- An officer assisted a neighboring agency with an armed individual who had multiple warrants and was in possession of a stolen vehicle. The individual attempted to elude the police, but officers were able to apprehend and arrest him.
- An officer responded to a Domestic Violence call. After speaking with the victim, it was determined the crime occurred on I-5. Washington State Patrol (WSP) responded to the scene and arrested the aggressor for Assault 4 Domestic Violence.
- Officers were dispatched to assist several agencies with locating a vehicle that was traveling at a high rate of speed on I-5. The vehicle briefly entered DuPont and then continued on I-5.
- After responding to a report of ignition damage to a vehicle, officers determined that the incident was an attempted motor vehicle theft.
