NEWS FROM PATROL

- Officers were dispatched to a reported burglary at a local school. Charges have been referred to the Prosecutor. In separate incidents, officers also responded to a burglary at a storage facility and a residence.
- A female reported being a victim of a physical domestic violence incident with her spouse during an argument. After speaking with the spouse, Officers found probable cause to refer charges for Assault in the 4th Degree to the Prosecutor.
- Several vehicles were marked with a warning or for towing due to DuPont Municipal Code violations and/or expired registration.
- Officers conducted a speed emphasis on Center Drive. A driver was stopped for a speed of 53 miles per hour in a 35 zone.
- Due to a partial closure of Steilacoom-DuPont Road during the weekend, officers assisted several semi-trucks that needed to be rerouted to their destinations within the city. Truck traffic was temporarily allowed on Center drive during this time.
