NEWS FROM PATROL

- Lakewood Officers were informed of a missing resident who was calling from DuPont prior to their phone losing charge. DuPont Officers responded to assist the individual on previous calls but were not aware that the individual was missing at the time. An officer was able to relocate the individual and transport the individual back to the care home in Lakewood, WA. Assistance rendered.
- Officers responded to a report of a group of juveniles throwing a rock at a vehicle passing by. The driver of the vehicle stated there was no damage to her vehicle. After checking the area, the juveniles had fled the scene and could not be located.

Scams to watch out for this season:

- **Fake order/shipping texts:** Always go directly to the retailer's app or website to check on your order status.
- **Charity scams:** The end-of-year always brings out fake charities looking to take advantage of your generosity. You can look up the group on [Charity Navigator](#) before donating.
- **"Friend or family in need" messages on payment apps:** Always call or text the person separately to confirm that they actually need help before sending any money or help.
- **Gift card payment scams:** Legitimate companies will never ask you to use a gift card as payment.
- **"You have a warrant for your arrest!"** Legitimate law enforcement agencies and/or the IRS will NEVER call you to tell you that you have a warrant, nor will they ask you to pay for one over the phone. Contact your local police department if you have legitimate concerns about a possible outstanding arrest warrant and how to take care of the issue.
